ATTENDANCE

Attendance in your classes every day is important!!

If you miss too many days in a class, you can fail due to absences (FA). The FA will be recorded as your final grade even though you have a passing average.

- Students are allotted 6 unexcused absences in a semester class, 3 in a quarter class, and 10 in a yearlong class.
- Absences documented with parent or medical notes are <u>not</u> excused absences, but these notes should be submitted to attendance to avoid truancy contact.
 - Students may attend Make Up School to recover up to 4 absences (\$20 per session)

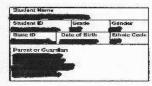

CONTENT RECOVERY

Students who are struggling in the classroom should ask their teachers for additional support. Students may be able to complete content recovery which helps to improve quarter grades while students are still enrolled in a class.

For more information, students and parents should reach out to the classroom teacher.

CREDIT RECOVERY

Students who fail a class with a final grade of 50-59 in a core class may be able to participate in credit recovery. Participating in credit recovery allows students to recover credit for a class by completing assigned units in the GradPoint online curriculum.

- Participation in credit recovery does not remove a failing grade from a student's transcript and does not impact/improve a student's GPA.
- Note The South Carolina High School League only allows 2 classes to be recovered per year for eligibility purposes.

Parents and students should discuss the credit recovery option with the student's assigned counselor as needed.

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

- Students must pass a specified # of classes each semester and year in order to be eligible for high school athletics (see page 14 in the 2023-2024 RHS Course Catalog).
- Fall/Winter sports eligibility is based on the previous year's grades and Spring sports eligibility is based on fall grades.

Note -

Students may only apply 2 credit recovery and/or summer school classes toward eligibility.

MILITARY EXPLORATION

Are you interested in the military??

- Military service can be full-time or part-time... You can also consider attending college and military service.
- Begin talking to military recruiters about their branch of the military and entrance requirements.
- Take ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)... This test is offered at South Pointe each year to all 11th graders and 12th graders who sign up.

GOING TO COLLEGE?

- Narrow your top choices to 5-7 schools
 - Consider the type of school: 4-yr, 2-yr, Technical, Vocational
 - Research admission requirements, majors offered, campus size, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Campus Visits/Open Houses
 - Juniors are allowed 2 excused college visit days
 - Must bring verification of your attendance on the school letterhead to the SPHS Attendance Office within 5 days of the absence to be excused
- Take SAT/ACT/Placement Test (as needed)
 - Fee Waivers available for SAT and ACT for those who qualify (contact Mr. Rogers in Guidance)

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTS


PSAT – All 10th grade students take PSAT each year in October. This is a great opportunity for students to get practice. 11th grade students can sign up to take the test. **This is the only test opportunity for 11th graders to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.**

ACT/SAT – We recommend college bound students begin taking ACT/SAT in the junior year. It is recommended that students have taken or be taking Algebra 2 Most colleges will accept either test. Students can take both tests to determine which is a better fit. **It is ideal for students to test 2-3 times prior to the senior year.**

Technical School Placement Test - Students who plan to attend a technical college may choose to take a placement test instead of submitting SAT/ACT scores. Scores are used to determine proper course placement. **Note – Some technical college programs require SAT/ACT scores for admission.**

TYPES OF COLLEGES

- TECHNICAL COLLEGES
 - EX: YORK TECH, MIDLANDS TECH, TRI-COUNTY TECH
- 2-YR COLLEGES
 - EX: USC LANCASTER, SPARTANBURG METHODIST
- 4-YR COLLEGES
 - EX: CLEMSON, SC STATE, USC COLUMBIA, WINTHROP



2-YR/TECHNICAL COLLEGE ADMISSION • York Tech uses EdReady to place students into the appropriate English and/or math class

- - EdReady can be taken online and does not require a test proctor
 - SAT/ACT scores may be submitted instead of the placement test (some programs require SAT/ACT scores)
- GPA Students may be admitted without the placement test if they have a 2.7+ Cum GPA. Students with a 2.7-2.99 are still encouraged to take the placement test in order to place into college level courses

4-YR COLLEGE ADMISSION

Students should research entrance requirements for schools they are interested in attending. Various factors are considered:

- Rigor of Courses
 - Schools may require specific coursework for admissions
 - Remember, 3 lab sciences (physical science is not a lab science), 2-3 units of foreign language, 1 unit of fine arts; CP level course work
- SAT/ACT Scores
 - Note: Many schools adopted a "test optional" policy during the pandemic, so students should check with their particular schools of interest to note what their policy will be for fall 2023
- GPA/Class Rank
- Extracurricular Activities/Community Service

4YR COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

English 4 Units

Math 4 Units (Algebra 1 (or the equivalent), Algebra 2, Geometry, 4th higher level math)

Science 3 Units Laboratory Science (Physical Science & Integrated Science are not lab sciences)

US History 1 Unit

US Government ½ Unit

Economics ½ Unit

Other Social Studies 1 Unit (World Geography or World History are strongly recommended)

World Language 2 Units (same language; Some schools may require 3 units)

Fine Arts 1 Unit

PE/JROTC/Band w/PE 1 Unit

Electives 2 Units

(Computer Science is strongly recommended as well as courses in the above listed categories)

Note – These are the general requirements for 4-year college entrance in SC schools. Parents and students are encouraged to research the specific admission requirements for schools of interest.

RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

In addition to your resume, you may want to consider providing answers to these questions when requesting a letter of recommendation. This type of information is very helpful in writing a more personal recommendation letter.

Be sure to request recommendation letters at least two weeks in advance!!

- How would you describe yourself?
- What characteristic or quality has helped you to be most successful?
- What accomplishment are you most proud of and why?
- Describe any circumstance or situation in your life that has helped to shape your character, personality, or attitude towards life.
- What are 5 random things about yourself you would like me to know as I write your recommendation letter. Feel free to share more than 5 if you like.

South Pointe offers **Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Dual Credit** courses. Review the RHS Course Catalog (pages 53-59) to learn more about these programs and course options.

NOTE – Students planning to take dual enrollment classes should meet with their counselor to discuss before enrolling as there is a Dual Enrollment contract that must be signed and approved by the Director of Secondary Instruction. In addition, only courses approved by Rock Hill Schools for dual credit may be added to a student's transcript for high school credit.
