

# Big Ideas

## Choose a saying or word that adds meaning to the visual.

"Be Fearless" or just the word "Fearless" Create some quick sketches/thumbnails of your idea. How will the letters fit into the shape of your image?

Next draw your subject using the letters of your saying to create the shape. In this example the word Fearless creates the image of a lion.



Sketch your subject first then trace it with Sharpie so that it is neatly drawn.



Outline your image in Sharpie, then using colored pencil fill in the letters. Be sure to use shading, light to dark!

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
