

Slide 1

Can we ingest Ascorbic Acid? Ascorbic acid (also known as vitamin C) is a white crystalline powder with a very acidic taste and has little to no smell and is used in living systems as a micronutrients necessary for life.

Slide 2

Ascorbic acid is a water soluble vitamin that has a formula of $C_6H_8O_6$, and its molecule has a total of 20 bonds which gives the molecule its octet or stability to be found in nature. In addition, the density is 1.65 g/cm³.

Slide 3

A Polish chemist and his colleagues developed a robust chemical/microbial process to produce ascorbic acid from D-glucose so that it can be used by people to help your body absorb iron to help with oxygen regulation.

Slide 4

Because our bodies can not produce ascorbic acid ourselves or store it, you must consume it in your diet. It benefits our health in many ways, especially with the healing process.

Slide 5

Vitamin C is found in acidic fruits like lemons, oranges, and grapefruits. It is an antioxidant agent that helps fight bacterial infections. Women should consume 75 mg daily and men should consume 90 mg.

Slide 6

Vitamin C is an essential nutrient for repairing tissue, the formation of collagen, and maintaining healthy bones, skin and blood vessels. It is even found in some serums to reduce wrinkles.
