Infographic Lesson Plan

- 1. After completing a unit focused on animals, group students into pairs and introduce them to the project topic (Are zoos good or bad?).
- 2. Students should discuss with their partner their view points. Together, they should determine their stance on the topic.
- 3. The students will find three supporting details to support their argument. (Students can come up with their own points or complete research. I had my students write their point of view on the top of a piece of paper. They numbered 1-3 to outline their points. They could have more than three points but not less.)
- 4. The teacher will use Cava.com to model how to create an infographic.
 - a. Click the create button to select an infographic
 - b. Browse templates
 - c. Change background color
 - d. Search for images and graphics
 - e. Upload own graphics
- 5. The teacher will go over the rubric in great detail and provide a copy for each student.
- 6. Students will work with their partner to create their infographic. (My students completed theirs in about 45 60 minutes. We broke up the work time into two days.)
- 7. Students will click to download their infographic as a JPEG. Then, they will email their work directly to the teacher.
