- Brainstorm ideas of simple drawings.
 (animals, plants, motor vehicles, people, school supplies, etc.)

 - 2. Gather resources to help you draw your idea. Look at books, magazines, or look up a reference photo on your technology.
 - 3. Brainstorm ideas of how your drawing could interact with a real object in a photograph, like the examples on the back of this sheet. The dog is interacting with the finger by biting it.
 - 4. Draw your drawing on paper with whatever materials you have available. Feel free to cut out images if you think that will make your idea stronger. Think about your composition and how it will also set up in a photograph.
 - 5. Finish your drawing and set up your photo shoot. You might have to gather supplies or ask for a partner's assistance.
 - 6. Use your technology to take a photo and upload to seesaw. Frame your shot meaning center your subject matter (your drawing interacting with the object) and take the picture. Take a few if you like, and upload them all!
