	A papule is a small solid raised lesion that is less than 0.5 cm in diameter		A plaque is a solid raised lesion that is greater than 0.5 cm in diameter
	A macule is a flat discolored lesion that is less than 1 cm in diameter		A patch is a flat discolored lesion that is greater than 1 cm in diameter
	A scale is a flaking or dry patch made up of excess dead epidermal cells		A crust is a collection of dried serum and cellular debris
	A wheal is a smooth, slightly elevated, swollen area that is redder or paler than the surrounding skin. It is usually accompanied by itching.		

	A cyst is a closed sack or pouch containing fluid or semisolid material		A pustule is a small circumscribed elevation of the skin containing pus
