Course Description:

This performance course will include the history of theatre and develop, through workshop exercises, dramatic techniques in acting from improvisations to play production. Students will write and perform skits, scenes, and plays to enjoy the experience of acting. Actors hone in on their prior acting skills and develop different characters. Students are encouraged to participate in one high school play, either in an acting or supportive role, and/or in stage crew capacity.

Course Objectives:

Students will:

- 1. Increase their comfort with taking risks
- 2. Effectively assess their work and that of their peers
- 3. Create positive, constructive feedback for their peers
- 4. Effectively utilize a variety of non-verbal communication techniques
- 5. Demonstrate mastery of concepts of dramatic action and subtext
- 6. Effectively perform a character analysis as well as a text analysis for a monologue
- 7. Upon the successful completion of this course, students will be able to:
- 8. Create publicity announcements, press releases and various others forms of communication and
- 9. promotional materials.
- 10. Identify and utilize basic terms used within theatre
- 11. Analyze, plan and choose a costume design for use within a production.
- 12. Understand the basic process a director goes through to take a project from inception to completion.
- 13. Understand and utilize various tools, materials, and documents to assist with the process of taking a production
- 14. and cast from beginning to end.
- 15. Plan and create a set design for use within a production.

- ➤ **25**% of the grade consists of Authentic Assessments (portfolios, performance assessments, projects, 21st Century real world experiences)
- ➤ 10% of the grade is Homework (including long term projects i.e. essays, research, and 20 to 60 minute reading depending upon grade level).

Homework:

Homework will be assigned daily and is expected to be completed in a timely manner. A missed assignment may be submitted at a later date for partial credit. Ten points will be deducted for each late day.

Projects:

Independent and collaborative projects will be assigned periodically.

Tests:

A test will be given at the end of each chapter.
