The Community, Enrollment, and Faculty

Jackson High School is a suburban comprehensive high school with a September 2024 enrollment of approximately 1,900 students in grades 9-12. The school serves Jackson Township, a residential community of middle to upper middle class families that is located 17 miles south of Akron, 8 miles west of Canton, and 5 miles north of Massillon.

The staff at Jackson High School consists of 117 certified professionals of which 96 hold advanced degrees.



- · 82.8% are pursuing higher education
- 73.7% are pursuing a 4-year degree
- 9.1% are pursuing a 2-year degree or trade school
- 12% are enrolled in institutions outside of Ohio
- 1.2% entered military services

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS CCP

College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual enrollment program that provides students the opportunity to earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking courses from Ohio colleges or universities. High school credits awarded for courses completed under CCP appear on the high school transcript and are computed in the GPA using a weighted scale based on the common subject area- not curriculum- of weighted AP courses.
