WHAT CAN YOU DO IF YOUR CHILD HAS BEEN ACCIDENTALLY EXPOSED TO ONLINE PORNOGRAPHY?

Accidental exposure to online pornography is becoming more and more common. If your child is among those who have been affected, what should you do?

1. Don't freak out. Staying calm will help your child know that you are a safe person to approach when things like this happen. (But maybe you're saying, "I already freaked out! Now what?" If that's the case, it's not too late to calm down, take your child aside and say, "I didn't handle that very well. I'm sorry. Can we talk about it again?")

2. Reassure them they didn't do anything wrong. Many children feel shame or confusion when exposed to explicit content. Help them see that exposure doesn't change the fact that they are an amazing human being!

3. Help them find positive things to do to fill their mind and their time. Curiosity or arousal often leads kids to seek out pornographic content again. Hanging out with friends, developing a hobby, playing a sport or exercising are all things that can help a young person's mind resist the pull of harmful online content.

4. Help them make a plan for when they come across pornography again. There is a plan called "Tic Tac Toe." The three T's stand for Turn it off, Talk to a trusted adult, Turn to something active. This can be a great way to remember to act quickly when something inappropriate pops up on a screen.

Remember, kids are resilient, so stay calm, reassure, fill time positively and make a plan. They can overcome this and so can you!

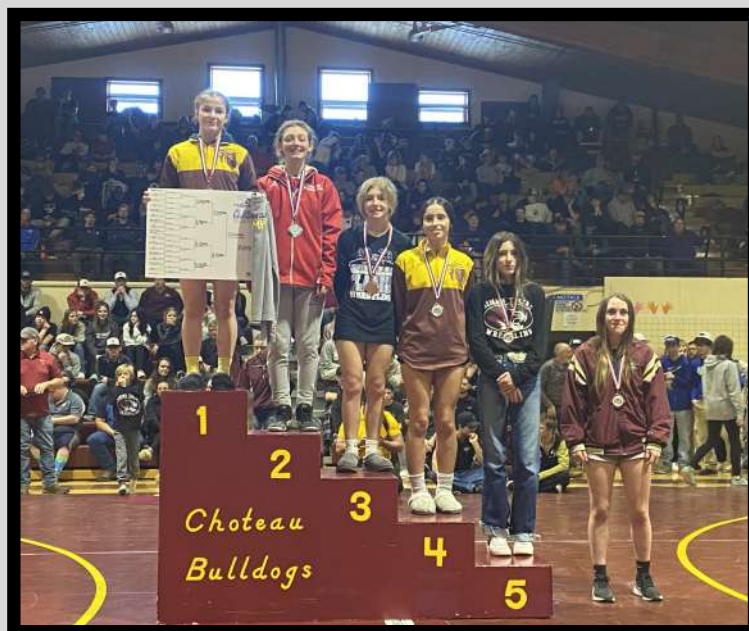

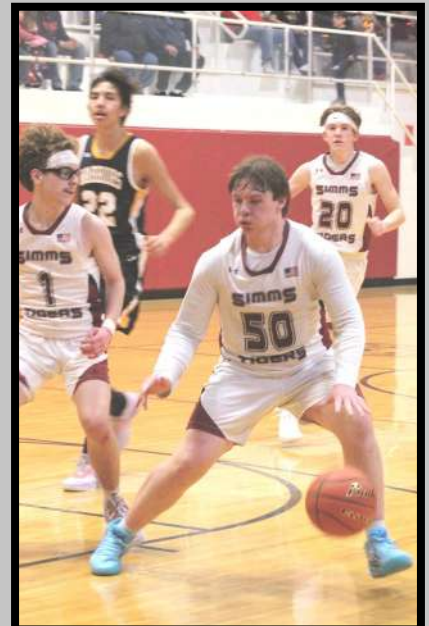

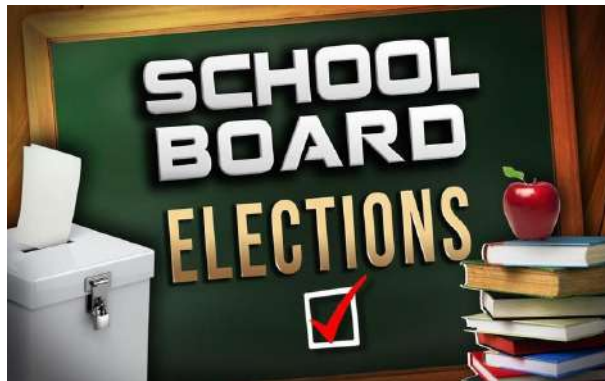

The office is open Monday-Thursday 8:00 AM-4:00 PM. The last day to file is Thursday, March 23, 2023. School Elections will be by mail ballot through the Cascade County Election Department Tuesday, May 2, 2023.

The district has two trustee positions open: one position on the combined high/elementary board; 3-year term (TJ Reifer) and two Vaughn representative; 3 – year term (Kristopher Rushton and an open seat).

Simms High School FFA



Simms FFA took 8 members to the Montana FFA Ag Expo, sponsored by John Deere. This event had over 1700 members from across the state compete in a variety of career and leadership events. Simms FFA had several finishes in the top half, which is a major accomplishment in events with this many participants. The Simms FFA team placed 8th overall with Mecede Mayer placing 10th individual and Grayce Hitchcock placed 17th. Morgan Feist participated in the Participants in the National FFA Employment Skills Leadership Development Event (LDE). These students get a leg up on their future careers by developing the skills needed to seek employment in the industry of agriculture. Morgan placed 37th out of 100 participants.

This fall, the Simms FFA and BPA students sold fruit, coffee, and Montana Boxes. The woods classes constructed 135 wooden crates for this year's sales. Thank you to everyone who supported our members.

The Glacier FFA District Leadership Development Events were held at Simms High School on December 14th. Over 70 FFA members from 10 schools were in attendance. We are very grateful to the people who served as judges for our events. The Simms High School kitchen staff provided scones and lunch that were terrific! Morgan Feist placed 10th in Employment Skills, potentially earning a spot to the state FFA competition.



We are quickly wrapping up the 1st semester of classes. There have been some great projects and activities taking place in the classroom and shop. Ag Mechanics has been working on how structures are built by building dog houses. Middle School is following the CASE AgX curriculum and has grown bucket gardens, explored fiber crops, and is looking into animal care. The Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources class has just finished up soil and is looking into water. The Ag Biology Class has done some anatomy with dissections of a variety of different species and is moving into animal behavior. We will be getting chickens at the start of 2023. Woods classes will wrap up with this semester. We have students building log beds, desks, organizational containers, and much more.

We encourage everyone to apply as soon as possible as there will be no grace period this year.

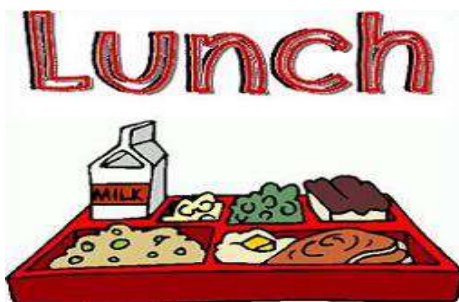
