





Please review our expectations for riding on school transportation during the winter months including extracurricular trips. When the snow falls and negative temperatures are unbearable, it is crucial to be prepared for an emergency. Make sure you send students to school with hats and gloves while making sure that pants are worn and open toe shoes are not allowed to be worn. The Sun River Valley School District would like to remind the community at-large of the importance of winter safety for both student drivers and students who ride the bus. Please be sure that students dress appropriately for school, recess and extracurricular activities. Elementary students need to be prepared for various types of weather during recess. In the event a bus should happen to break down, sandals and open toed shoes are not going to be appropriate in winter weather. Parents, encourage student drivers to take the bus to school. Oftentimes, inexperienced drivers are safer taking the bus.

#### Additional tips for a safe ride:

While school buses are, by far, the safest way for students to travel, children need to do their
part to stay alert and aware of their surroundings to prevent injury. We urge parents to teach
their children the following safety rules for getting on and off the bus, and for exercising good
behavior while riding.

#### Getting on the Bus:

- When waiting for the bus, stay away from traffic and avoid roughhousing or other behavior that can lead to carelessness
- Do not stray onto the street, alleys or private property
- Line up away from the street or road as the bus approaches
- Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before approaching the bus
- Use the handrail when boarding

#### Behavior on the Bus:

- Don't speak loudly or make loud noises that could distract the driver
- Stay in your seat
- Don't put your head, arms or hands out the window
- Keep aisles clear of books and bags
- Get your belongings together before reaching your stop
   Wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat

#### Getting off the Bus:

- Use the handrail when exiting
- If you have to cross in front of the bus, first walk at least 10 feet ahead until you can see the driver
- Make sure the driver can see you
- Wait for a signal from the driver before crossing
- When the driver signals, look left, right, then left again. Walk across the road and keep an eye out for sudden traffic changes
- If your vision is blocked, move to an area where you can see other drivers and they can see you
- Do not cross the center line of the road until the driver signals it is safe
- Stay away from the rear wheels of the bus at all times.

## **Counselor's Corner**

Welcome to Semester 2! Students finished up their 1st semester courses on January 11th. Report cards were mailed out the following week. If you have not received your child's report card, please reach out to the office and let the secretaries know!

<u>Semester Failures</u>: If your high school child received a failing semester grade in a core class, they will need to make up those credits in order to be on track to graduate with their class; failure to do so can greatly impact their graduation progress. Students can either repeat the semester/course in the next school year during the offered semester or use our online program, Edgenuity, to recover the credit in the summer. The district <u>does not pay</u> for Edgenuity credit recovery; the cost for a semester class is currently \$275.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): The government finally released the 24-25FAFSA form. This form must be completed for any senior student who needs assistance paying for college next year to determine their eligibility for aid, as well as those applying for certain scholarships. Due to the FAFSA not being released until December 31st, some colleges have pushed their own FAFSA deadline back to a later date. Students should check with the college hey plan to attend next year to find out what their FAFSA deadline is. The federal deadline is June 30th, but individual college deadlines are usually much earlier.

<u>Scholarships:</u> Senior students have access to a Google classroom where numerous scholarship opportunities are posted; now that we are past the first of the year, many local scholarships are released. Seniors should be checking the Google Scholarships and College Classroom for updates. Any scholarship information that comes across my desk is posted there. Scholarship opportunities go unclaimed every year due to students just not applying. Students will need letters of recommendation for a number of these scholarships; they should ask for those letters well in advance of when the scholarship is due, as well as provide a resume of their background. This makes it much easier to write a solid recommendation letter.

<u>Middle School:</u> With the new semester, middle school students are working on some SEL (social-emotional learning) bi-weekly, in units on Self-Esteem (6th) and Stress Management (7 th). The 8 th graders are starting a unit on college preparation, researching different colleges that interest them to see if they could potentially attend them.





On January 15th, Simms High School students competed at Business Professionals of America Regionals in Great Falls. Simms students experienced career development, learned professionalism and listened to a speaker from MSU. All 29 students that competed, qualified for State in Billings in March. ## Simms Spirit Team




