ABOUT OUR CLUBS

Cheerleading & Pep Squad: The J.B. Martin Cheerleading Squad is designed to promote school spirit throughout the school year. The cheerleaders are selected by tryouts. To be eligible for tryouts, students must have been a member in good standing of the pep squad for the entire 6th or 7th grade year.

The J.B. Martin Pep Squad works hand-in-hand with the cheerleaders and helps to promote school spirit by participating in the cheering. Students participating in both groups must meet the eligibility of our athletic program.

Yearbook: J.B. Martin's Yearbook Staff is a service organization for the school. It is primarily responsible for assembling the school's yearbook, *Cougar Tracks*.

Students must submit an application to be considered for yearbook staff. The staff is chosen by the sponsor based on an essay which is included in the application.

Student Council: The Student Council is an organization which plays a major role at J. B. Martin Middle School. Its members are elected by the student body each year. Student Council sponsors dances, dress-up days, and other exciting activities.

The requirements to run for Student Council are as follows: Students must have a 2.0 average in conduct and must maintain a 2.0 average in academics. Students must campaign for office and deliver a short campaign speech.

Beta Club: The Junior Beta Club provides an opportunity for the school's most outstanding students to network and encourages high academic merit and achievement. Students are selected for membership based on academic achievement.

The Beta Club is designed to be a service organization for school and community and to reward academic efforts. Each year, students have the opportunity to participate in interschool academic and talent competitions at the district and state levels at the annual state convention. Beta members have the chance to meet Beta members from across the state.

4-H: The 4-H Club is America's largest informal educational program for boys and girls. It is both family and community oriented. 4-H members devote much of their time to community service. Members learn by doing. They keep records, make oral presentations, develop management and communication skills, and gain an understanding of citizenship responsibilities.

STUDENT SERVICES

Counseling...Two full-time counselors work with students on personal, social, and academic concerns. Large group presentations, small group counseling, and peer mediation is available to meet the needs of every student.

Library....One librarian and one library assistant help students in the library. Computerized circulation services insure efficient management of the large collection of books, magazines, audiovisuals, and technological tools found in the library.

*Health...*One itinerant nurse provides health care for students. Regular health screenings and attention to special medical problems are provided. The school nurse is at J.B. Martin on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

Peer Mediation... This service is provided "to empower students to resolve their own disputes in an informal, non-threatening setting." Selected students are trained in conflict resolution skills and become the peer mediators. When a conflict between two students arises, the peer mediators, under the supervision of a selected staff member, meet with the students to assist in resolving the conflict.

Project Labs ... This state of the art computer lab is available for all students to use. This Pentium-based lab is used by teachers to integrate technology into instruction. There are more than 200 computers school-wide for student use.

Science Lab...The purpose of the Science Lab is to create a hands-on, minds-on environment where students are able to "do" and think about science. The lab promotes the development of scientific knowledge, skills, and processes through active experimentation, data collection, analysis of results, and drawing conclusions.
