EARLY LEARNING PTO

Jordan Public Schools believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning. Along with our Parent Aware Rated preschool and ECFE programs, we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help when extra help is needed.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3–6 Intervention

The Early Childhood Special **Education (ECSE) Preschool Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool). For more call (952) 492-3233.

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.





Early Childhood Screening

Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.

Esperar hasta que su hijo tenga 4 o 5 años para realizar la prueba puede ser demasiado tarde.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

GRADES 1–4 BACK-TO-SCHOOL

Before school starts in the fall, all students and families in grades 1-4 will meet individually with their teacher to drop off school supplies, discuss grade level expectations, curriculum and Jordan PRIDE, and be assessed in reading and math. Kindergarten families will have a separate Back to School Conference Day on August 29 (see Kick Start to Kindergarten article).

The JES Back to School Conferences/Curriculum days will be held on Tuesday, August 27, from 12pm-7:30pm and Wednesday, August 28, from 9am-4:30pm. Students and families will meet with their homeroom teacher for approximately 30 minutes (15 minutes in the classroom with the teacher and 15 minutes for assessments). Afterwards, students and families will have the opportunity to travel around the building checking in with specialist teachers (Music, Art, Phy. Ed. and Media/Tech), support staff, school nurse, or office staff. Please remember that in order for students to be enrolled at JES, we need proof of immunizations or a conscientious objection form on file and supply a copy of their child's birth certificate. Students <u>will not</u> get their picture taken during this time; instead they will be taken during the school day on Thursday, September 26.

JES families in grades 1-4 will receive a letter in mid August about the Back to School Conference Days and who your child's teacher is for the fall. The letter will contain information on how to sign-up online for a conference time on either August 27 or 28. If you did not receive a letter, are new to the District, or do not have access to our school website to register for these conferences, please contact the JES office at 952-492-2336. **We only have one time slot available for each student to meet with the classroom teacher and complete assessments, so please plan accordingly if you have a dual household.**

Morning AM drop off for grades K-4 is from 7:40am - 8:10am.

- ALL families will enter and exit the south parking loop via Aberdeen Ave for pick up and drop off.
- Please <u>DO NOT</u> line up in the loop prior to 7:30am since supervisors do not start assisting students into the building until 7:40am.

Afternoon PM pick up for grades K-4 is from 3:15pm - 3:30pm.

- Please DO NOT line up in the loops prior to 2:45pm. Preschool pick up occurs at 2:30pm and we need to keep the back loop open for those families to ensure the safety of our youngest students at JES.

-Remain in your vehicle during drop-off or pick-up until a supervisor reports to the loop. Please make sure your child exits and enters your vehicle on the right-hand side of the vehicle.

-Have your child practice buckling themselves in so we can keep traffic moving forward and we don't have to wait for adults to stop and buckle students into their seats.

-Stay alert to traffic moving in the back loop. Stay off of cell phones and make sure to move up close to the vehicle ahead of you to prevent a long backup on our city streets.

NOTE: If you need to drop off or pick up at any other time during the school day please park in the main lot in the visitor spots, enter through the front of the building, and check in at the main office.

The staff at Jordan High School looks forward to welcoming our students for the 2024-2025 school year. We are excited to welcome back students with a new secure entrance and front office. The activities office and attendance administration will be located in this new area. All visitors will report in through this office. Students arriving late or leaving with a pass will use the new office for



attendance purposes. The former main office will continue to be the home for our school counselor, school social worker, dean of students, and principal.

We are excited to host our ninth year of Freshman FOCUS, to assist in the transition for our newest students to the high school. All 9th grade students will report to school on Tuesday, September 3. We will take the students through an orientation, community building, and walk through their schedule. We find this to be a great day to ease the nerves of students new to JHS. On the same day, September 3, our grades 10-12 students will "Go Remote" and will be responsible for checking in online with their teachers and completing assignments remotely. See more on page 65.

Teachers will again be using Google Classroom, a learning management system, that will help students organize their calendars and keep track of assignments. Parents will have access to their students' account and will be able to see what students see when they go into Google Classroom. Teachers will organize the sites by courses that include folders for each unit. These folders may include presentations, links, videos, assignments and/or guizzes to be completed digitally, curriculum information, the class syllabus with classroom expectations, and other information. Parents will also be able to access a daily or weekly summary with assignment due dates and test dates.

During the past nine school years, students have become accustomed to working with Google docs and saving their assignments to the Cloud. This allows students to collaborate with each other and their teachers simultaneously. They can access their documents using their Chromebooks or any other device, including their phones, from any location. Storing work on the Cloud means students will never lose their assignments or forget them at home; they can easily retrieve them from home and school. Finally, teachers can respond to student work more quickly as well.

The 2024-2025 school year will include a number of classes that allow our students opportunities to earn college credit or grow their skills in the trades. A student at JHS could earn over 45 college credits without ever leaving the building. We are extremely proud of the opportunities that are offered for students to challenge themselves while continuing to work with our faculty at JHS.

The beginning of the school year is always exciting. We encourage our students to take their education seriously and begin to decide who they want to be and how they are going to get there. As always, the staff



Scott County Public Health provides an Immunization Clinic twice a month at Government Center West 200 Fourth Avenue West Room 136 Shakopee, MN 55379. Please park in Lot A on 4th Avenue. Enter through the north door, go up the stairs, and then enter through the Health and Human Services door located on the right side. This clinic is for residents whose insurance does not pay for immunizations, and residents who do not have insurance. The immunization clinic does not replace well-child checkups or annual physicals. 
