

The Minnesota State Amateur Baseball Tournament is celebrating its 101stAnniversary in 2024. Belle Plaine, Green Isle and Jordan will be hosting the 32 team Class B and 48 team Class C Tournaments. Teams will be vying for the title of State Champion for ten days over three long weekends starting on August 16, 2024. After approximately 70 games, the tournament culminates with championship games on Labor Day weekend.

The tournament is expected to draw between 25,000 and 30,000 spectators, 80 teams and over 1,400 players. It is a fabulous opportunity for communities around the state — from rural to urban — to come together for a summer activity that is part of a century and generations — old tradition.

There will be various options for volunteering during the state tournament to make this a great tournament. Please see the dates below for the weekend dates of the tournament.

# **EARLY LEARNING PTO**

Jordan Public Schools believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning. Along with our Parent Aware Rated preschool and ECFE programs, we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help when extra help is needed.

### Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

### Age 3-6 Intervention

### The Early Childhood Special **Education (ECSE) Preschool**

**Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool).

### **Preschool Screening**

### Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.

Early Explorers, a Parent Aware 4-Star Rated Program, is a caring, warm and happy place for preschoolers to learn and grow. Our preschool offers an expanded traditional curriculum in a preK-4 setting. This means learning beyond the traditional preschool room! To prepare for Kindergarten and beyond, your child will be oriented to the amenities of

our elementary school - art, music, gym, media center, outdoor STEAM exploration, and a hot lunch option for full-day preschool.

**Early Explorers** activities include circle time, art, music and movement, story time, stations, a library day and a snack. We have a literacy-based curriculum that incorporates the SMART room, Handwriting without Tears and SMART board activities, meeting State Indicators of Progress, Kindergarten Readiness, and field trips through the year. Personal and social wellness is nurtured through the Pyramid Model — a positive intervention strategy supporting social-emotional well being of child. # Early Childhood Screening



Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.

# **BUILDING** PROJECTS UPDATE









### REFERENDUM PROJECTS UPDATE

In April 2023, the Jordan Public Schools district community supported a building bond referendum that would allow for renovations and additions at Jordan Elementary School and an updated secure entrance at Jordan High School. Since then, we have engaged with staff, students and community members through multiple rounds of input and feedback, and worked with our architecture and design firm, ISG, to finalize designs for the upcoming building projects.

The designs include extensive renovations to the 1970s portion of Jordan Elementary School, light renovations to the remainder of

Jordan Elementary School, a seven classroom addition, and an addition to include additional office space with sightlines for increased security, a kitchen/cafeteria, a gymnasium/storm shelter, and additional restrooms. Jordan Early Learning Services will also be renovated to include a secure entrance and updated classroom spaces. Jordan Elementary School and Jordan Early Learning Services projects will also include updated playground spaces with accessible ground surface (goodbye woodchips!). At Jordan High School, the updated secure entrance design includes a reception area and additional office and work spaces.

This fall, our designs went through a legal bid process, and we are excited to break ground at Jordan Elementary School this spring! As you will see in the chart on the next page, we will have multiple phases of construction over the course of the next 18 months, with the renovations and additions being completed by Fall 2025.

We know that every building in our district will be impacted and we'll be asking for a lot of flexibility and patience from staff, students and community members throughout construction. This summer we will already feel this as much of our regular summer programming will shift to Jordan Middle School to allow for the work of the construction crews at Jordan Elementary School and Jordan High School.

### **TIMELINE AND PHASING**

Construction work will begin this spring. One of the first things we will see is a section of our Jordan Elementary School property fenced off for heavy equipment. This will encompass the front staff parking lot and the area around the Jordan Elementary School playground. Students will continue to have use of the green spaces behind Jordan Elementary School to run and play this spring during recess and physical education classes. At Jordan High School, we will begin to see some work happening for the building roof replacement.

**ELEMENTARY SCHOOL** JES is having a fantastic school year! Students are continuing to explore and discover more about coding and engineering/design with the creation of projects using 3D printers in Media/ Technology, as well as engaging in other project-based learning opportunities in classrooms. Staff embed Culturally Responsive Pedagogy strategies and Restorative Practices and conversations throughout the day to meet the diverse needs of students. We are committed to supporting relationships and intentionally teaching skills that promote collaboration, self-regulation and problem-solving to ensure each person feels cared for and valued.

Staff and students serve others through various teaching and learning activities. Our DLC Juniors (Diversity Leadership Crew) lead monthly Harambee gatherings to celebrate differences and recognize achievements made by adult and student learners. Grade 4 students have been learning valuable life skills during the Leadership Course taught by Grade 4 teachers, encouraging students and staff to grow their Jordan PRIDE (Preparedness, Respect, Integrity, Dependability, Excellence). They support younger students through tutoring sessions, sharing school and district news and activities via the JES News broadcast, and serve in other leadership roles that arise throughout the school year.

We are looking forward to welcoming incoming Kindergarteners and their families to our Countdown to Kindergarten Round Up event. MIDDLE SCHOOL

JMS has had a fantastic first half of the year. Each day the JMS staff greets approximately 600 students, inspiring them to create, design, and engage in meaningful learning. Grade level teams collaborate on interdisciplinary instruction in the areas of reading, language arts, science, social studies, and math with enrichment and intervention opportunities to meet students' individual needs.

Diverse exploratory and elective courses at the middle school level provide an opportunity for students to find their individual gifts and talents. - Entering school buildings through the secure visitor entrances, providing a photo ID as part of the visitor sign-in process, and wearing a visitor badge while in our school buildings.
- Following the school zone speed limit of 20 mph when children are present, using blinkers when turning in/out/around the school district campus, yielding to pedestrians in crosswalks, and stopping your vehicle when the School Safety Patrol flags are out in the intersection.
- Helping our schools ensure student safety and control the flow of traffic during pick-up/drop-off times by following the procedures that are outlined by each school building.


### **Privacy**
