Freda McDonald was born in 1906. She would be known as Josephine Baker. Her father left her family when she was young. She grew up very poor. To help support her family, Josephine began working when she was a kid.

New York to Paris!

Josephine knew that she couldn't be a star in America, so she moved to Paris, France. She was known for her dancing and funny acting. Author Ernest Hemingway saw her perform. He called her, "the most sensational woman anybody ever saw." She had finally made her dreams come true.

Her Secret Life

Josephine had found success in Paris, but World War II started in 1939. At one point during the war, Germany had invaded, or taken over France. Josephine wanted to help the French army, but how could she help? She was just a dancer.

Josephine kept performing her shows, and often German military men would come to enjoy them. She would listen closely to their conversations. She would then use invisible ink to write down what she heard. She gave these notes to the French army. These notes helped to defeat the Germans.





Why We Remember HER-Story

Josephine was a brave spy. She was also a talented entertainer. She was not given a chance in America due to the unjust laws.
