PHS Graduation Requirements

- **4 credits English**
- **4 credits Math**
(min of Algebra II required for 4 year college acceptance)
- **3 credits Science**
*(min of 2 lab sciences required for college admission;
Bio/Chem; Physics required for Engineering/PT/Nursing)*
- **3 credits Social Studies**
- **2 credits Phys Ed/Health**

PHS Graduation Requirements

- **.50 credit in Fine Arts**
(Chorus, Band, or Art)
- **5.5 credits in additional electives**
2 Years minimum of the SAME World Language
(required for 4 year college acceptance; 3 recommended)
- **Successful completion of**
Digital portfolio and Senior Passion Project

Total number credits for Graduation: 22 total
18 CORE ACADEMIC CREDITS
required for 4 year college acceptance

Relevant Senior Schedule

- Selection of courses for senior year takes place in January.
- It is important to choose **appropriately challenging** courses.
- No matter what your child's post high school plans, the high school transcript will be viewed.
- It is highly discouraged to drop a class after the add/drop period in the senior year...only under extenuating circumstances with administration's approval.
- A "W" withdrawn will show up on the transcript.

GPA - Grade Point Average

- The GPA includes all classes- except those outside of the 7 credits.
- We report on the weighted GPA to colleges
- Our transcript includes both simple and weighted GPA
- Honors Level and AP courses hold an extra weight in the GPA
- **Cumulative GPAs are calculated every SEMESTER.**
 - **Therefore, the GPA your child earns at the end of Junior year will essentially be the GPA that appears on college applications.**

Dual Enrollment Opportunities

CCRI Running Start Program

- Complete senior year of high school and freshman year of college at the same time
- No fee to attend. School district pays for books
- Deadline April 15
- 3.0 High School GPA
- PSAT/SAT above 410 in Reading/Writing and 411 in Math
- If no PSAT/SAT scores, must score college ready in Reading, Writing and Math on Accuplacer

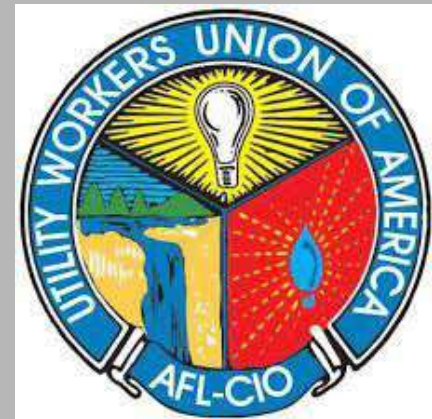
