2014-2015 Presidential Physical Fitness Award Winners

Congratulations to the 2014-2015 Presidential Physical Fitness Award Winners. Here is the list of students from NLES who achieved Presidential and National rankings. Next year, the Presidential Physical Fitness Awards will be replaced by the Presidential Youth Fitness Program (PYFP), a "health-related, criterion-based assessment" which signals a move away from measuring students' performance and puts more emphasis on assessing students' health. Under the new program, students' fitness will be measured using the Cooper Institute's FITNESSGRAM, which measures five areas of health-related fitness: aerobic capacity, body composition, flexibility, muscle strength, and muscular endurance.

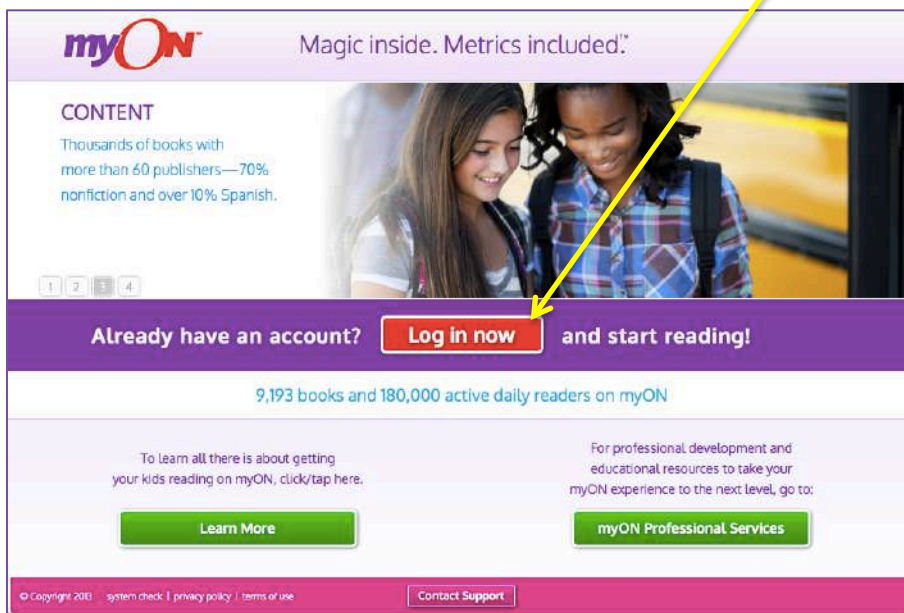

The Goals: (Your teachers set these goals to make it obtainable for every student! Go for it!)

Students entering:	Goal for each of the sessions (dates listed above):
1 st grade	3 AR points per session (for example, that's about 6 picture books!)
2 nd grade	4 AR points per session (ex. 8 picture books or a couple of beginning chapter books)
3 rd grade	5 AR points per session (for example: one or two short novels)
4 th grade	6 AR points per session (for example: one or two short novels)
5 th grade	7 AR points per session (for example: two short novels or a solid 5 th grade level one!)
6 th grade	8 AR points per session (for example: two average upper grade books or a nice thick one)
7 th grade	9 AR points per session (for example: that's one nice thick one and one small one!)
