Dear Patrons,

Another successful school year is behind us. Summer school is well underway. It runs until June 29. Before you know it, we will be welcoming students back to school for the 2023-2024 school year. But there is still a lot to be done before that can happen. Work continues on the renovation of the Early Childhood Center. It will be ready to welcome students in August. At the elementary school, work continues on asbestos abatement and renovations of classrooms. This has been an ongoing project for many years.

If you missed the news, the District has been awarded a \$350,000 grant from the State of Missouri to enhance safety and security around campus. Work on this has already begun. The District will install bullet-resistant safety film on all exterior doors. Improved security cameras will be purchased and installed in all attendance centers. New equipment will be purchased for our School Resource Officers to use in case of an emergency, additional emergency medical bags will be placed in all schools, and SRO's and staff will receive additional training. The safety and security of our students and staff is our top priority and it is one that the Festus R-VI School Board takes seriously. We are tremendously excited for the improvements that will be made and grateful to the state for making the money available.

On behalf of the entire Festus R-VI School Board and the District, I hope you have a wonderful summer. We will see you again in August.

Festus Scores Well In State Annual Performance Report page 2

The Festus R-VI School District scored a 90.2% in the Annual Performance Report (APR) released by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). That is among the top 10% of all public and charter schools in the state of Missouri. This is the first year of Missouri's sixth update to the statewide school improvement plan called MSIP 6. Scores released this spring were based on student achievement tests taken in the spring of 2022. For various reasons, this is the first APR score schools have received since 2018. However, because the 2023 scores are based on different criteria, it is not possible to accurately or fairly compare the 2023 score to the score received in 2018. For the 2023 APR, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education awarded schools points based on different criteria: test scores, student growth, student readiness for college or the workforce, student attendance, graduation rate, the presence of a student academic plan, and the presence of a comprehensive school improvement plan among others. The Festus R-VI School District received 162.4 out of a possible 180 points, or 90.2%. The 2023 APR scores are being used as a baseline for measuring school performance. In future years, APR will be used to determine a school's accreditation. Based on a score of 90.2%, the Festus R-VI School District would maintain full accreditation.

Open houses begin on August 15th. As this date rapidly approaches we are working hard to get everything ready for the upcoming school year. From the end of the school year, until open house we have around 440 hours to accomplish everything. A few examples of the work being done by the Maintenance and Custodial department include: surface wax and clean approximately 445,515 sq ft of flooring and space, servicing 310 pieces of mechanical equipment, HVAC, freezers, coolers, ice machines, water fountains, hot water boilers and water heaters and inspect and test all emergency lighting and fire alarms and doors. Construction projects happening this summer are: renovations to 6 Elementary classrooms providing public utilities to our Transportation Department. Our Facility use calendar will be open to schedule events for the upcoming school year beginning July 1st. Summer is finally here! While summer is a great time to relax and have fun, it is also important for students to avoid the summer learning loss or "summer slide." Just a half hour a day can help keep students from regressing academically over the summer. Here are some easy, fun, and engaging activities that students can do in 30 minutes or less:

1. Read, read, read! Encourage your child to read a little every day!
2. Listen to an audio book in the car when traveling.
3. Have your child/children keep a writing/drawing journal of fun activities.

Counselor's Corner



In March 2021, the counseling department was asked to present to the school board regarding the needs of our students and the future of the counseling department. In the last several years, the rise in mental health needs of students has received a great deal of attention from politicians, media, and the public. In addition to the mental health needs of our students, we have also continued to have increased enrollment in our district. As the student to counselor ratio grows, we are not able to meet the needs of our students at the high standard we have set for our district. During our board presentation, we explained why a fully staffed counseling department would benefit all students. We are so grateful for our school board's willingness to continue to add school counselors. We added an elementary school counselor and middle school counselor for the 21-22 school year. We are so pleased to announce that we will be adding another high school counselor for the 23-24 school year. The current student to counselor ratio at the high school is approximately 360 to 1. The addition of this counselor will lower that ratio to approximately 265 to 1, which is more closely aligned to the Missouri School Counselor Association/American School Counselor Association model for a fully implemented Comprehensive School Counseling Program. This will allow us to create more meaningful relationships with all of our students and better assist them in their individual student planning and career development as they transition to their life after high school.

Early Childhood Program

The Festus R-VI School Districts Tiny Tigers Academy is set to open in August. The program will offer half day sessions Monday-Thursday and follow the Festus R-VI School District calendar. The Early Childhood Program will serve district resident preschool children who are at least three years of age on or before July 31, 2023. In addition to classroom teachers, each classroom will have a paraprofessional in the room. All of the teachers are excited to start this program and look forward to meeting their students in August!

I hope you all are enjoying your summer so far! Summertime presents a great opportunity to get caught up on overdue wellness screenings and get a jump start on required paperwork for next school year. Here are a few important items to consider as you make plans for the summer months.

SUMMER WELL-CHILD CHECKS

Summer is a great time to catch up on annual check-ups. Well-child checks are important opportunities for your pediatrician to assess your child's growth and development. You are able to discuss any concerns you may have and ensure that appropriate milestones are being met. These appointments are also the perfect time to make sure all required vaccines have been administered and your child is ready for the upcoming school year.

VISION SCREENINGS

The learning environment of the 21st century requires that all students have adequate vision for computer use, reading, reading comprehension, writing, homework, examinations, and all other aspects of learning. Regular and comprehensive eye exams are crucial for detecting vision problems and essential in facilitating a student's academic success. Comprehensive and regular eye exams are the only effective measure of ocular and visual health. When vision problems are not detected in childhood, they can significantly affect a person throughout their whole life. If you have any concerns regarding your child's vision or their academic performance, it is vital that you schedule an appointment with an eye doctor even if your child has 'passed' a school vision screening.

MEDICATIONS

Remember that new 'Medication Disbursement Authorization' forms are needed every school year for medications taken at school, including inhalers.

Please be sure all prescriptions are up-to-date and the medication has a valid prescription label. You can find the consent form on our district website.

EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS

Emergency Action Plans also need to be updated yearly. Emergency Action Plans are required for anyone diagnosed with asthma, seizures, or severe allergies that have emergency medication at school. Emergency Action Plans need to be completed and signed by your child's physician and turned in to the Health Room at your child's school. Blank Emergency Action Plans can be found on our district website.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Missouri State law requires that your students have the appropriate immunizations to attend school. If you choose not to have your child immunized, or their medical condition requires that they cannot be immunized, parents need to go to the Health Department or to their personal physician to have an exemption card completed and provide the card to the school nurse. If you have health insurance that covers vaccines, please set up an appointment with your child's doctor's office. If you have Medicaid or no insurance coverage for vaccines, you may receive immunizations at little or no cost through the Jefferson County Health Department. For further information on receiving immunizations from the Jefferson County Health Department, please contact them at 636-797-3737. You can find the 2023-2024 Missouri School Immunization Requirements on our website.

Tech Talk

Summer is one of the busiest times of the year for the Technology Department. Typically this is the time of year that we can implement projects that cause network outages that cannot take place during the regular school year. This summer will be no different.

The biggest project this summer will be the installation of new Fiber Optic backbones from our Data Center to each building. The existing fiber optic lines were installed just over 20 years ago, and have well surpassed their normal lifespan. The new fiber optic lines will support speeds up to 10 gig between our buildings, an upgrade over the 1gig speed of our current connections. This work will be completed by LinkData out of O'Fallon, MO. The total cost of the fiber project is \$81,596, and is eligible for 60% reimbursement from the Federal E-Rate Program.

The E-Rate Program is managed by the FCC, and they allocate money to schools based on their "Free and Reduced Lunch" ratios. Based on our current "Free and Reduced Lunch Rate" we are eligible for a 60% discount on hardware and installation costs. This is one of the many reasons why it is important that all families fill out the "Free and Reduced Lunch" paperwork at the start of each school year. If our rate drops our eligible discount rate could also drop.

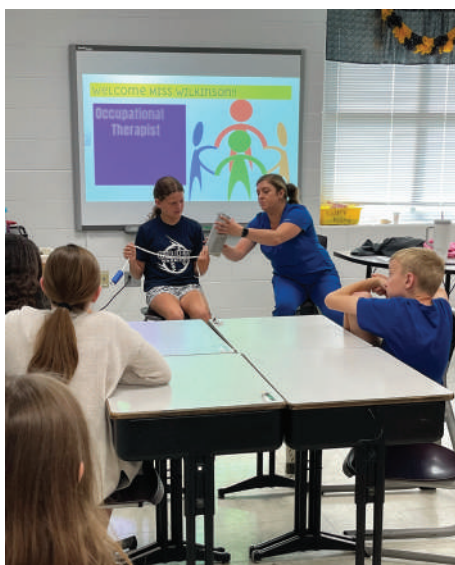
Intermediate School Students Celebrate the End of the School Year

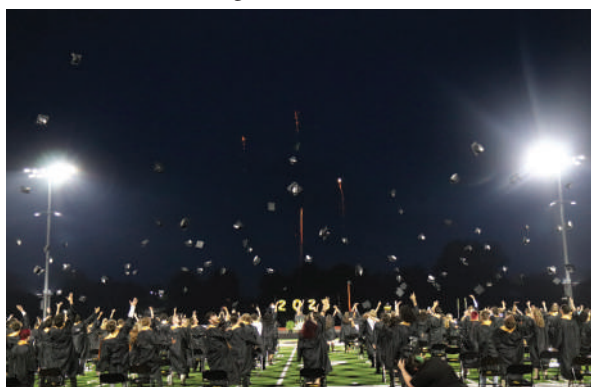

Sara Clonts and Alexander Gibson were the recipients of the Karen Tesreau Trust Scholarships. The Tesreau Scholarship is awarded to students planning studies related to music.

The JoAnn Thurman-Mangan Drama Scholarship was established to proudly honor Mrs. Mangan's legacy at FHS. She was a beloved Educator at FHS from 1978-2006. 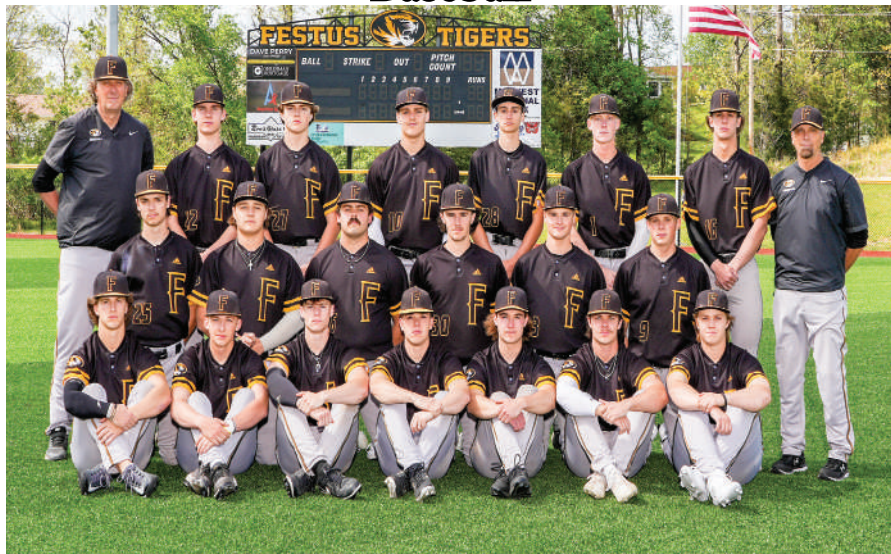
