



~ From the Desk of the Superintendent ~

As we finish the 2017-2018 school year we have already planned for the 2018-2019 school year. The Sun River Valley School District developed a strategic plan in 2016 with the Montana School Board Association, teachers and community members. This plan has allowed us to create a new direction for the school district to strategically focus its resources on identified wants, preferences, and needs of the students and the community.



One of our big goals has been to seek out grants and alternative funding sources to enhance our curriculum and academics. Passing the elementary technology levy and obtaining additional grant money through E-Rate has allowed our districts to flourish in the area of technology infrastructure and curriculum. Not only do we buy new technology when necessary we take advantage of second hand computer opportunities that allow us to have an effective computer inventory rotation at minimal cost. Completely re-wiring our buildings provides a stable environment for these computers to periods in, plus allows

us to deploy additional technology such as laser engravers, plasma cutters, 3D printers and digital routers.

We have current versions of Microsoft Office, Adobe Creative Cloud, and this was our first year of providing access to CAD with licenses for SolidWorks. These softwares provide the students with hands on experience with the industry standard. We also ensure our students are fluent in the Cloud with easy access to Google and all that it provides. Additionally, our districts provide Accelerated Reader, typing programs, and iPad apps for reinforcement. We are continually making great strides in moving forward with technology used safely. Our automated doors, plus surveillance cameras on both campuses and on the buses, help to ensure your child's safety.

The Montana Literacy Grant we received this year will continue through the next three years. We have ordered our PK-12 reading series and are excited to start in the fall. The \$900,000 grant will afford our students the best curriculum and provide our teachers enhanced professional development opportunities with the goal of effectively using relevant and contemporary technologies to enhance teaching and learning. In addition to all programs and services, we strive to make enhancements in our offerings with the goal of implementing an individualized approach to education and create opportunities in the areas of dual credit and self-study courses for students who excel in these types of learning environments.

Through our efforts in actively promoting our community and our school, we have successfully attracted and retained quality staff who are highly enthusiastic and actively engaged in our school and community functions. We are actively seeking alternative housing options for our staff within our community. We promote our model of positive leadership and supportive professional development as we explore options for enhancing both the financial and intangible offerings to employees that attract and keep quality staff employed in our District and vested in our community. 



Hello, many of you may know me, but I would like to introduce myself. My name is Thad Wollan and I will be returning as the Simms Middle School football coach for the 2018 season. I will be visiting with the middle school boys in May to introduce them to my thoughts pertaining to education and football. I am a middle school teacher at Vaughn Public School and I believe academics are extremely important. I expect classwork and behavior to always come first, then football.

Football practice will start on Monday, August 13th. I am hoping to hold the first week of practices, August 13 to August 16, from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Times may be changed as we get closer to the beginning of the season. Sun River Valley Robotics 724 Rednek Robotics Wun - High School 14019 Static Mechanix - Middle School By Marshall Kunkel



Robots 724(high school) and 14019 (Middle School) are the two teams that competed in a competition called FIRST in September. In FIRST there are different kinds of challenges that you compete in: FRC, FTC, Lego League, and Lego League JR. 724 and 14019 are privileged to have Chuck Merja as their mentor. He is a "retired" engineer that graduated from Stanford University. 724 and 14019 competed in FTC (First Tech Challenge) along with 5000 other teams from around the world. 724's team consists of 3 members Winston Fee (senior), Luke Osberg (sophomore), and Holter Sand (sophomore). Winston is the team captain and he is the robot driver, programmer, builder, and does a lot of CAD (computer-aided design). Luke is also a team

driver, CAD worker, and builder. Holter is the coach and builder. As a coach, he keeps track of time, communicates with other teams, and tells the drivers what to do. This year was their 3rd time qualifying for WORLDS competition and winning 3 out of 4 years. This year they went to Butte, MT (award winning alliance captain), Cedar City, UT (award winning alliance), Helena, MT (award winning MT State alliance captain), Ogden, UT (Utah State winning alliance), Spokane, WA (Western Regionals award winning alliance captain), Houston, TX (WORLD CHAMPION award winning alliance).

Robot team 14019 consists of 4 junior high team members: Marshall Kunkel, Andrew Hanson, Carsten Brooks, and Boyd Helms. This team competed against high school teams at 6 events around the northern United States. Marshall is the team captain, robot driver and builder. Andrew is the team driver and builder. Carsten is the team's coach and programmer. Boyd is the builder, backup coach, and scout. The job of a scout is to watch teams to see which ones are the best in the event. The Simms' Middle School robot team is in the top 4 and must choose their 2 competition alliances. This year was their first year as a team where they were chosen as the Utah State winning alliance competing against high school teams. The reason this team was started is because there was an increase in the number of people doing robotics. The places they went to in order are Butte, MT, Helena, MT, Cedar City, UT, Bozeman, MT, Ogden, UT, then Moscow, ID.

Our mentor, Chuck Merja, has been known to get joy from watching 20,000 NERDS "problem-solving in the pressure cooker of competition. It gives him hope for the future".


