



Baker College of Owosso – College Fair

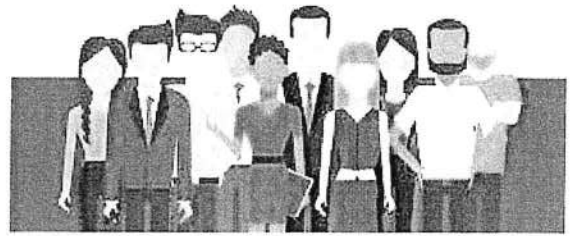

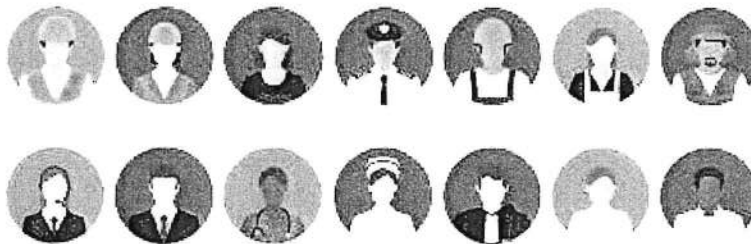
