

Art – Nicole Hoff – Grades K-5 – Found Object Printmaking

Learning Objectives/Assignment:

Students will create a work of art using printmaking. Students will use found objects from around their house to stamp in paint (or other media) to make repeated images. Students will watch the instructional video, learn about printmaking vocabulary and techniques, prepare their materials, make the artwork, and then fill out the google form to report their learning. Students will be asked to photograph or videotape their work to share with Mrs. Hoff and they will have the option to share their work in our online gallery.



Grades K-3: Create a work of art using found object printmaking.

Grades 4-5: Create a work of art using found object printmaking that utilizes the concept of radial symmetry.

Vocabulary/Glossary:

Printmaking: Using a stamp or tool to make a mark on paper with ink.

Symmetry: When an object is made up of two exact parts that match when folded in half along a central line.

Line of Symmetry: The central line indicating the two halves of a symmetrical object.

Radial Symmetry: Symmetry around a central point. An object that can be divided into equal, repeating pieces and has multiple lines of symmetry.
