Monday (4/13) No School - No Assignment

Tuesday (4/14)

- Addition with coins - Get 8 different coins. Look at the year they were made. Add all the numbers of the year together. Ex: penny made in 2013- Add the numbers  $2 + 0 + 1 + 3 = \underline{\quad}$ .
- Count by 10's to 100 using a whisper voice, monster voice, squeaky mouse voice, and robot voice.

Wednesday (4/15)

- Write the subtraction problems on a piece of paper. Use cereal, toys, or other items to count and solve. Answer the questions:

$$5-2=\underline{\quad} \quad 3-3=\underline{\quad} \quad 1-0=\underline{\quad} \quad 4-3=\underline{\quad} \quad 5-1=\underline{\quad}$$

$$4-1=\underline{\quad} \quad 2-1=\underline{\quad} \quad 5-4=\underline{\quad} \quad 4-4=\underline{\quad} \quad 6-3=\underline{\quad}$$

- Write your numbers 0-20 on a piece of paper. Fix any backward numbers.

You will say what number comes after the number your family member told you. For example: A family member says 46, you would say 47. A family member says 82, you would say 83. Do 10 of these.</li> </ul>
