
DISTRICT OVERVIEW

TRANSPORTATION AND WALK ZONES




- **One mile or under** is considered the "walk zone" for elementary schools.
- If your student requires bus transportation and you live outside the walk zone, **please register as soon as possible in your parent portal.** You will find this in the registration area under "Forms" and then "Transportation."
- **Bus assignments will be posted the weekend before school begins.** This will include:
 - bus letter (ex. Bus R, Bus M, etc)
 - bus stop locations
 - approximate pickup and dropoff times



NOVI COMMUNITY EDUCATION'S CARE PROGRAM

- State-licensed before- and after-school program.
- Offered at all five elementary schools, as well as Novi Meadows (fifth and sixth grade) and the Early Childhood Education Center for preschoolers.
- CARE is open from 6:45 a.m. until the start of the school day, and after school until 6:00 p.m.
- Activities include sports, games, computers, literacy and free-choice time.
- **Registration and September scheduling begins August 1-August 15! After August 15, please call the office for availability.**
- Scheduling is on a month-to-month basis. Therefore, when registering in August, schedule for the last week of August and the month of September only.
- Please Note: Registration only without a schedule for September does not hold your spot for the school year.



SAFETY AND SECURITY

- Background checks required for all volunteers each year including grandparents, aunts, uncles, etc... Not able to do last-minute checks.
- Cameras around entire facility
- Visitors must wear a badge (Raptor)
- Secured entrances at each building
- Classroom doors locked
- ALICE protocols—emails to all parents after safety drills
- 2 District School Resource Officers
- Supervisor of Safety and Security



LUNCH/FOOD SERVICE

- 20 minutes to play & 20 minutes to eat (practice!)
- Eating with new friends is different than eating with a family

HEALTH AND MEDICATION MANAGEMENT PLANS

- If your child has a medical need, please indicate that as you register. Please also contact the school office so that we can work together to support your child.
- Forms are available on the district website. Some of these forms need to be signed by a physician.
- Students may not self-possess any medication without documentation from a medical provider.



ENGLISH LEARNERS

- There are over 50 languages spoken and more than 70 countries represented!
- Students who **speak** or **hear** a **language other than English** at home will take the WIDA Screener English test (Listening and Speaking only).
 - Students who score **4.9 or below** in either Speaking or Listening are identified as English Learners and become eligible for ELD support.
 - Students who score **5.0 or higher** in both Speaking and Listening are monitored until December/January, when they will take Reading and Writing.
- ELD teachers and interventionists work in the classroom, in small groups, and one-on-one with English Learners to help them develop English skills in reading, writing, speaking, listening, and academic language.

KINDERGARTEN SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL EXPECTATIONS

- Be responsible for personal belongings (backpack, coats, shoes, lunch boxes, library books, daily take home folder)
- Get dressed independently, including zippers and shoes
- Independent toileting
- Easily separate from parent/guardian
- Lunch - opening containers and eating within 20 minutes
- Work, play and interact appropriately within a large group
- Taking turns
- Delaying immediate needs



KINDERGARTEN ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS

- Begin to recognize letters and numbers
- Learn to respond to, recognize in writing, and write own first name
- Practice coloring, cutting and glueing
- Follow directions from various adults
- Attend to a task in a variety of settings (independent, small group, Whole group)



KINDERGARTEN EXPERIENCE

- Kindergarten is a full day experience, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:52 p.m.
- The students do not have a daily nap/rest time.
- Kindergartners will eat lunch each day in the cafeteria. They can either bring a lunch from home or order a school lunch.
- There is also a daily snack time (Healthy snack brought from home and water bottle).
- They will have both a 20-minute recess before lunch and a “teacher recess.”
- Students will go to a “special” class each day (art, music, media, physical education).



KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMMING

- Programs offered in all elementary schools
- Aligned to State of Michigan Kindergarten Standards
- Full-day program
 - Social development
 - Emotional development
 - Fine/gross motor skill
 - Oral language
 - Fundamental literacy skills
 - Mathematical number sense
- Opportunities for students to build social-emotional, academic and creative learning
 - Music, Art, Physical Education and Library/Media
 - Lunch, recess, and all school assemblies
 - School wide support services and resources



NOVI VIRTUAL

- K-12 Flexible Option with Novi Teachers and Curriculum
- Ideal for:
 - Families who travel internationally for an extended time
 - Students with extenuating health needs
 - Elite athletes and performers with rigorous schedules.



KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMMING

WILDCAT LAUNCH

- **Two-year** kindergarten experience
- Places greater emphasis on play and exploration
- Smaller class sizes
- The emphasis is placed on introduction and exploration, rather than mastery of kindergarten skills


KINDERGARTEN

- **One-year** kindergarten experience
- Places greater emphasis on academic goals
- It is designed for children who turn five before September 1st
- The emphasis is placed on the mastery of Kindergarten skills

 - Current rental agreement with tenants and occupants names
 - Two of the following are required
 - Gas Bill
 - Electric Bill
 - Renters Insurance
 - Bank Statement
