



























**Kindergarten I Knowledge I2

**Part I (Activity Page DA-I)**

4. <b>Nation:</b> Is our school a nation?	 
5. <b>Monarchy:</b> Is a monarchy ruled by a king or queen who makes the laws for everyone?	 


























6. <b>Colonists:</b> Were some of the early colonists Pilgrims who came to America to live and go to the church they wanted to attend?	 
7. <b>Independence:</b> If a colony is ruled by a king in another country, does it have independence to make its own decisions and laws?	 
8. <b>Capital:</b> Is Washington, D.C., the capital of the United States?	 
9. <b>Carved:</b> Was the mountain at Mount Rushmore carved so it looked like four very important presidents?	 
10. <b>Sculptor:</b> Is a sculptor a person who paints pretty pictures?	 
11. <b>Honest:</b> Does an honest person tell lots of lies?	 
12. <b>Clever:</b> Would a clever person know how to solve a tricky puzzle?	 
13. <b>Respect:</b> Do most people respect, or think well of, a person who is smart, honest, and hard-working?	 











14. <b>Expert:</b> If someone does not know very much at all about a subject, does that mean they are an expert on it?	 
15. <b>Accomplishment:</b> If someone works at something for a long time and finally is able to do it, like learning to read or learning to ride a bicycle, then is that an accomplishment?




1. This president was the first president of the United States.
