













1. <b>Canoes:</b> Did Native Americans use canoes to travel in rivers and lakes?	 
2. <b>Moccasins:</b> Did Native Americans use moccasins to keep their hands warm?	 
3. <b>Shelter:</b> Would a tent make a good shelter in a rainstorm?	 
4. <b>Warrior:</b> Are warriors brave men that go to battle?	 
5. <b>Chief:</b> Was the chief the least important and powerful person in the tribe?	 





6. <b>Powwows:</b> Do some Native American tribes still hold powwows today to celebrate their traditions?	 
7. <b>Bay:</b> Is a bay a hot, dry area that gets very little rain?	 
8. <b>Tepees:</b> Are tepees good shelters for tribes that moved around because they were easy to set up and take down?	 
9. <b>Totem Poles:</b> Were totem poles decorated with colored carvings that represent stories and historical events important to the tribe?	 
10. <b>Wigwam:</b> Is a wigwam a type of food eaten by Native Americans?	 
11. <b>Agile:</b> If a cat jumps from one chair to another, is it agile?	 
12. <b>Mischief:</b> Would putting sugar in the salt shaker be an example of getting into mischief?	 
13. <b>Succulent:</b> Is a piece of dry toast succulent?	 

14. <b>Feast:</b> For Thanksgiving, do some families feast on turkey, mashed potatoes, corn, green beans, and pumpkin pie?	 
15. <b>Traditions:</b> Do some families have special traditions like eating certain foods on holidays?
