STANLEY Z. KOPLIK CERTIFICATE OF MASTERY WITH DISTINCTION APPLICATION

Deadline: July 1, 2021*

The purposes of the Certificate of Mastery are to:

- Recognize high academic achievement on MCAS and other measures of academic achievement;
- Recognize high academic achievement as identified by outside forums including competitions, student publications, and awards;
- Provide an incentive for students to perform to the best of their abilities on MCAS and on the course of studies beyond grade
 10: and
- Recognize high academic achievement in areas not included in MCAS.

Who is Eligible?

To be **eligible to apply** for a Stanley Z. Koplik Certificate of Mastery Award, a student must:

- Be currently enrolled in a Massachusetts public high school. (Students who have graduated high school, Homeschool students and students enrolled in private school are not eligible to apply)
- Be a permanent Massachusetts resident.
- Be a United States citizen or eligible noncitizen.
 (In order to use the tuition credit portion of the Certificate, students must be eligible to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA))

Award Amounts:

Recipients of the *Stanley Z. Koplik Certificate of Mastery with Distinction* are eligible for an award of a non-need-based tuition credit for state-supported undergraduate courses. Individual student awards shall be no more than the resident undergraduate tuition rate at the participating institution. The tuition credit must be used in the <u>September following high school graduation</u> and is valid for eight (8) consecutive semesters provided the student maintains a G.P.A. of 3.3 for continued eligibility. If the G.P.A. falls below the 3.3 then the student loses the credit.

Students MUST file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in order to use the tuition credit portion of the Certificate.

Requirements for the Stanley Z. Koplik Certificate of Mastery with Distinction

SECTION I:

Initial Requirements:

To initially qualify, a student must meet the initial qualification based on Grade 10 MCAS Scores. Because of the <u>transition</u> to the <u>next-generation MCAS tests</u>, there are currently different requirements for **initial qualification**, depending on the student's original class, as shown in the table below:

Classes of 2021 and 2022

Earn the minimum score listed below on **ONE** of the tests:

- ELA 501
- Mathematics 504
- High School S/TE 260

Earn the minimum score listed below for each remaining test:

- ELA 472
- Mathematics 476
- High School S/TE 240

Requirements for the classes of 2021 and 2022 reflect an interim standard for ELA and Mathematics defining a level of achievement on the new tests that is similar to the standard on the legacy tests.

Students who have met this requirement will receive an eligibility letter from their high school during their junior year.

SECTION II:

Application:

Students in the graduating class of 2021 must complete and submit the application for the Koplik Certificate of Mastery with Distinction by July 1, 2021. The application must be submitted to the high school's Koplik Coordinator or School Counselor for proper review, certification and submission to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Applications sent directly to the DESE will be returned to the high school for proper processing. Successful applicants will receive the Certificate of Mastery with Distinction from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary & Secondary Education.

Applications for the class of 2021 WILL NOT be accepted after July 1, 2021.

SECTION III:

Academic Achievement Requirement* (per Massachusetts 603 CMR 31.05(2)): Students may choose to submit a combination of TWO options below in DIFFERENT content areas*:

- A score of 3 or better on an AP exam (student may opt to submit scores from 2 AP exams in different content areas)
- ONE Certification of Outstanding Achievement from department head**
- ONE Certification of family/community leadership from department head**
- ONE Certification of completion of advanced course work**
- International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP) and be awarded either a full Diploma or a Bilingual
 Diploma during or upon graduating from high school. Students who are awarded a Certificate through the
 IB Programme must receive a score of a <u>5 or better</u> during or upon graduating from high school.
 Documentation is an official transcript from the International Baccalaureate Program.
- Massachusetts Seal of Biliteracy
- Receive a grade of *B* or higher on a college course taken during high school. Documentation is an <u>official</u> <u>transcript</u> from an accredited college or university.
- SPECIFIC National Honors Societies (e.g., NMHS, NFHS; general NHS membership does not qualify)

Competitions, Prizes, Awards, Publications: A student must win a prize or award in a competition or be selected for an activity or publication, beyond the local school level, based on excellence in achievement in an academic or artistic field. Evidence could be a certificate, award, article or excerpt and title page from a publication, or a letter from a sponsoring organization indicating the level of work the student accomplished. Sample of programs (NOT an exclusive list) is on page 5 of this application packet.

(**Please see your Koplik coordinator or guidance counselor for the official documentation for this option.)

* Please note

1. (per Massachusetts 603 CMR 31.05(3)): Test scores (in any combination) and /or academic achievements **MAY NOT** be in the same **content** area.

For example:

- a) If a student passes an exam in any area of biology, then (s)he may not submit scores from <u>any</u> other academic achievement in science (e.g., chemistry, physics, earth science, etc.)
- b) If a student passes an exam in any area of social studies, then (s)he may not submit scores from any other academic achievement in history/social studies (i.e., microeconomics, psychology, world history, etc.)
- c) If a student passes an exam in any area of math, then (s)he may not submit scores from <u>any</u> other academic achievement in math (i.e., calculus, statistics, etc.)
- d) If a student passes an exam in any area of English/language arts (ELA) then (s)he may not submit scores from any other academic achievement in ELA (i.e., Literature, English Language and Composition, etc.)
- e) If a student passes an exam in a foreign language then (s)he may not submit scores from any other academic achievement in the same language area (i.e. German and German Language & Culture, etc.).

- 2. The following exams/programs/achievements **DO NOT** meet the criteria for the Koplik Certificate of Mastery with Distinction (Please note that this is not intended to be an exclusive list):
 - a) ACT Exam Scores
 - b) Girl Scout Gold Award
 - c) MA Student Trooper Program
 - d) National Honor Society (General Membership)
 - e) National Society of High School Scholars (General Membership)
