Introduction

L blends: We learned that about CVC words. They have a consonant, vowel and then another consonant. Today, we are going to look at words that have a 4th sound. These words have 2 consonants before the vowel and we call them CCVC words. All of our words today are going to have the first consonant and then the 2nd one will always be the letter I. Sometimes when you say the first 2 consonants at the same time, their sounds often blend together and it might be hard to hear the 2nd sound. Today, we will focus on paying attention to the 2nd sound /I/ in our reading and writing.

Articulatory Gesture

When we make the /l/ sound our tongue lifts up and touches the soft part behind our teeth.
