Unit 3: Argumentative Essay

An **Argumentative Essay** is a piece of writing that presents a belief, conclusion, or stance; supported with reasoning and evidence; used to change a reader's point of view or opinion or to bring about an action or a response from a reader. In other words, you are writing to convince someone to believe something or to do something.
