I. Introduction

- A. Introduce your topic in an interesting way
- B. Thesis statement: topic + should (be able) + because + explain why.

II. First Point

- A. Introduce your first idea: One reason why is...
- B. Information about this idea (good area to add information from online source)
- C. Summarize why this first point is valid

III. Second Point

- A. Introduce your second idea: A second reason why is...
- B. Information about this idea (good area to add source)
- C. Summarize why this second point is valid

IV. Opposite of your belief/claim

A. Introduce the opposite point (what the other side thinks.) *People that disagree might say...*

- B. Write about why you disagree with the opposite side. However, this is not right because...
- C. Summarize why your side is valid
- V. Conclusion
 - A. Restate the main thesis statement: *In conclusion*...
 - B. Talk about why your two main points are important
 - C. Try to leave your reader with something to think about. Consider asking a question.
