- 6. Why do you think the seafarer tells about his life and its hardships? Cite details from the poem to support you opinion.

- 5. What happened to cause the poem's **title character** to become a wanderer?
- 6. What emotion does this poem chiefly invoke in you?
- 7. How would you describe the wanderer's present life and his feelings about it?
