PMC KIDS RIDE: June 23



Coordinators for the 12th annual Westwood PMC Kids ride, being held this year on Sunday, June 23 @ 8:30am, have announced that this year's ride will be dedicated to Westwood 4-year-old Daniel Kelleher. The event, will honor Daniel's 2 year battle with cancer and celebrate the end of his treatment which he wrapped up in February. "Daniel had just turned two when he was diagnosed," says mom Lori Kelleher who was 9 months pregnant with her second child at the time. "We had brought him to the doctor because he had started limping a few days prior and after some blood work they sent us right to Children's where we camped out for the next month so Daniel could receive treatment." Daniel was diagnosed with Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia (ALL) which is a type of blood cancer that can progress rapidly if not treated immediately. "Three days into our stay," continues Lori, "I walked over to

deliver my daughter at Brigham and Women's and brought her back over. The staff and nurses at Dana-Farber did such an amazing job accommodating the four of us so we could all be together."

"The crazy thing about all this is he wasn't ever a sick kid. He was always smiling and running around, he was just a happy, easy little boy, and this diagnosis came out of nowhere. It could truly happen to any family." Daniel continued to receive chemo on a weekly basis (in addition to 9 different drugs he had to take daily) for the next two years.

"Not nearly enough money goes to pediatric cancer research," Lori says. "Every little bit helps, whether it's funding or awareness, anything we can do to make people understand how devastating a cancer diagnosis is for a child and their family. Starting to teach kids at an early age to give back is so, so important. Funds from events like the Westwood PMC Kids ride help to support families like mine. It pays for the treatments Daniel had, the toys he played with while undergoing chemo, and now the monthly labs and check-ins that he will continue undergo."

"We aren't out of the woods yet," says Lori, "side-effects of treatment could rear their ugly head at any time. But we hope the worst of it is behind us. Our goal is to get Daniel's story out there so other families going through what we did can see that there is a light at the end of all the treatment."

News from 3M (Ms. MacDonald)

In Life Science 3 MacDonald is studying the social and group behavior of



animals. In this cooperative activity, students act like zebras in a pack. The objective is for kids to experience the benefit of animals working together. The "pack" of 5-6 students were blindfolded and had to work together to find a "water source" placed in the classroom. All the members of the pack had to hold onto a rope and crawl behind the pack leader. The pack leader had to lead the pack successfully to the water source.

Halfway to the water source the last student in the pack had to let go of the rope and find the water source alone without the help of the pack. After the activity, all students agreed that finding the water source was easier when they worked together as a group.

News from Music (Mrs. Saada-Smith)

It's busy in the music room! Mrs. Saada-Smith's music students in Grade 4 have been learning about Theme and Variations. They studied Aaron Copleland's "Appalachian Spring" and Charles Ives' "Variations on America". They are now creating their own Theme and Variations on various instruments of their choice.
