Learning Goal

What To Do #1

- 1. Choose a new photo.
- 2. Look at your photo and observe the setting, characters' body language, and interactions between the people. Record your observations in your chart.
- 3. Chose a character. Infer the internal thoughts for that character based on your observations. Record your ideas in your chart.

What To Do #2

- 1. Circle one of the internal thoughts.
- 2. Draw a line from the circled internal thought to any observations—no more than three—that led you to create the internal thought.
- 3. Write 2–3 sentences explaining why or how those details from the photo made you think of that internal thought for your character.
