2. unsteady

tiresome: (adjective) likely to tire one because of length
or dullness : boring <a tiresome lecture>

interesting: (adjective) holds your attention, to arouse or hold the interest of

considerate: (adjective) thoughtful, tending to consider things carefully, thoughtful of the rights and feelings of others

heedless : (adjective) not thoughtful, thoughtless

ridiculous: (adjective) silly, absurd, preposterous

sensible: (adjective) wise, showing or containing good sense or reason
