



# Done List

**When You're Done!!**

6. Highlight the first 2 words of every sentence.

7. Try 2 more hooks on a sticky note. Which do you like better?
8. Does your sentence length vary? Does it pass the Slinky Test?  



Tasks on the "Done" list need to be specific and, when possible, incorporate a writer tool. Although the list may start off generic at the beginning of the year (see #1 and #2), as you teach new lessons, add them to the list. By growing the "Done" list, you hold students accountable for the skills you're teaching them.

# Revision Strategies

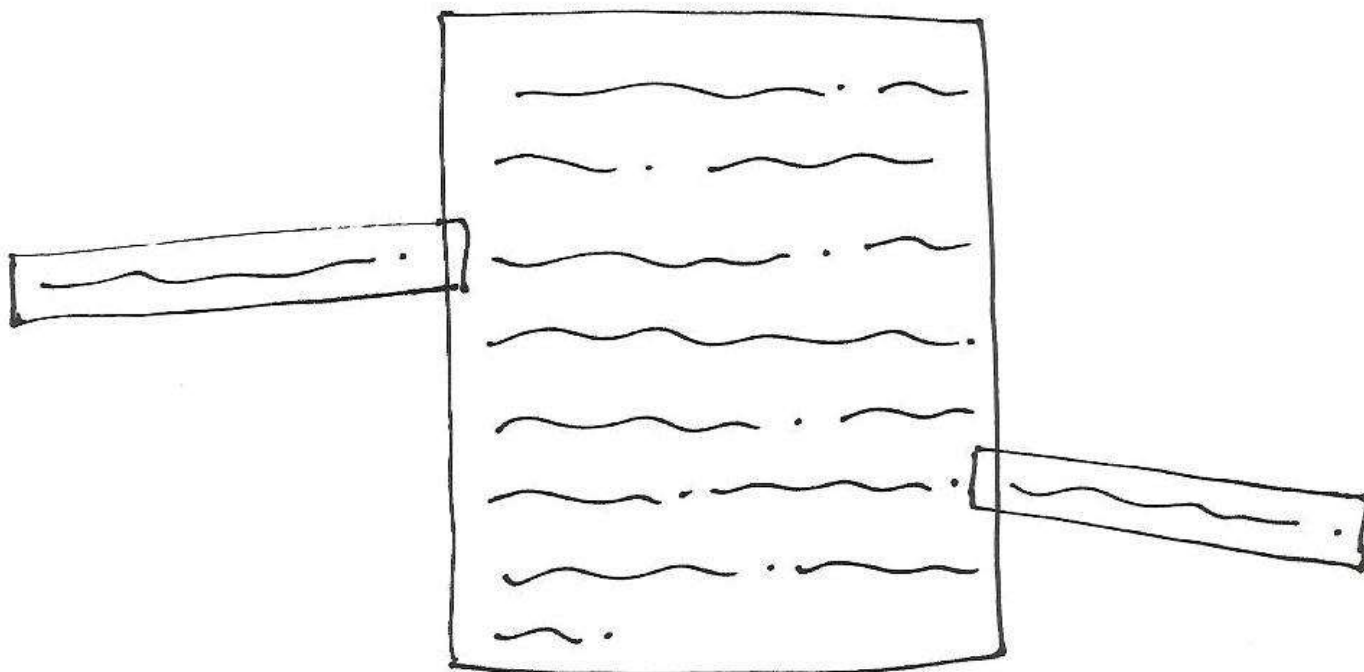
*When needing to delete or replace a word/phrase, simply strikethru.*



Three lines of wavy lines representing text. The first line has a caret (^) above it. The second line has a caret (^) above it. The third line has a caret (^) above it.

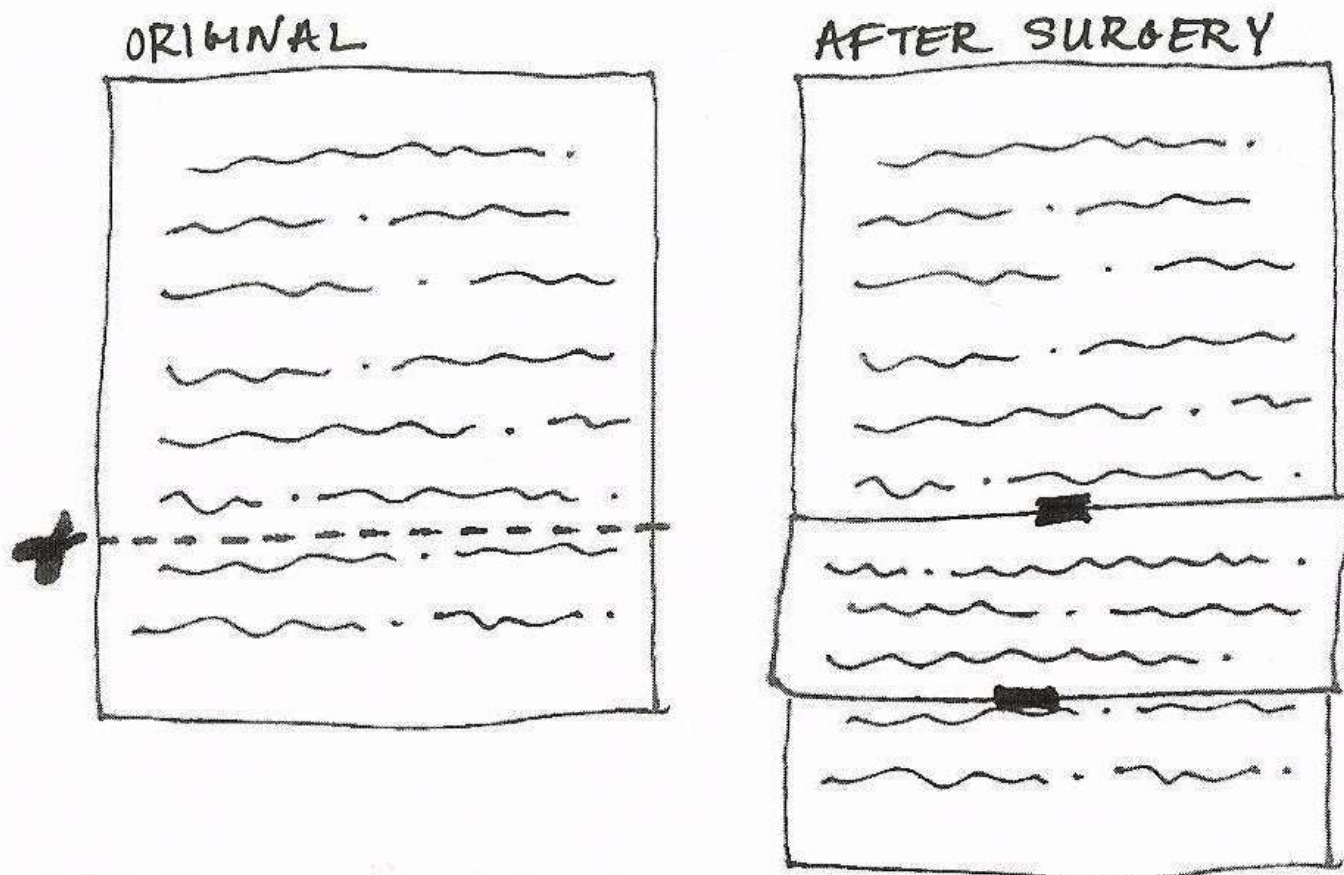
*When adding a word or two, the caret is a simple way to insert details.*

# Revision Strategies



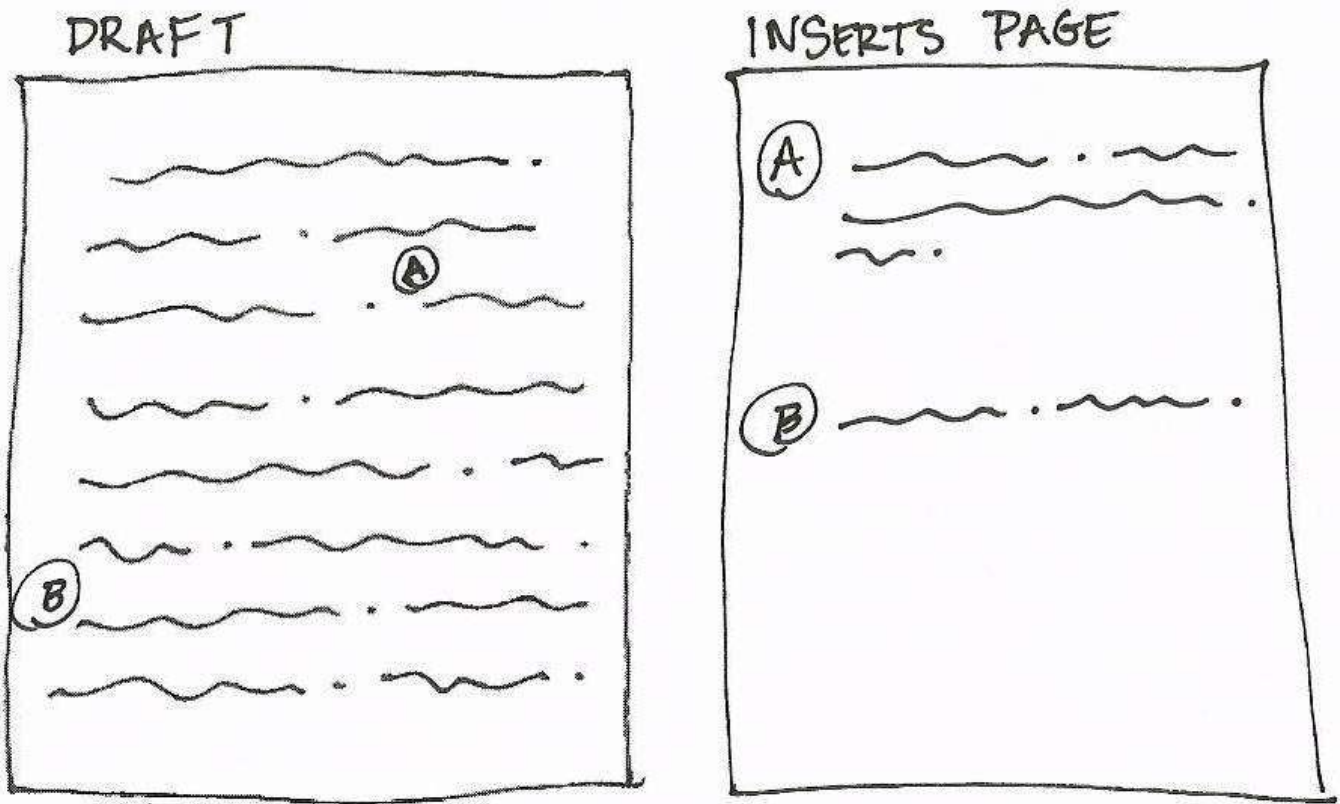
*If a student wants to add a sentence or two, then spider legs is a perfect technique. The student writes his sentence on a strip of paper (a "leg") and then tapes it onto the "body" of the piece, right where he wants to insert it.*

# Revision Strategies



*When needing to add larger chunks of text (multiple sentences at a time), a spider leg won't provide enough space. Suggest story surgery. This is when the writer cuts apart his story (where he wants to insert an additional paragraph of text) and tapes in another sheet of paper. Compare story surgery to "cutting open the story" and "messing with the guts." NOTE: This technique also works well when students need to rearrange the order of sentences or paragraphs.*

# Revision Strategies



*For the student who needs to add in a chunk of text but doesn't want the mess of story surgery, suggest he create an inserts page. This would require another whole sheet of paper. Using an endnote symbol within his draft, the writer indicates where he wants to add more. Then, using the same symbol on the inserts page, he drafts the additional sentences.*
