High School – Application needed (optional).

# Meal Prices for High School are as follows:

Reduced Breakfast: \$0.30 ea.

Reduced Lunch: \$0.40 ea.

Full Pay Breakfast: \$1.80 ea.

Full Pay Lunch: \$3.35 ea.
