As fall continues to settle in, it is also time for Parent/Teacher conferences. Sign-up has been strong and the office staff can assist any families that have been unable to login to sign up for conferences. This conference opportunity provides teachers and parents the time to talk about the 1st quarter of the school year and to put some plans in place to continue or improve success. Thank you for taking time out of busy family schedules to work together with your child's teacher.

As we prepare for the fall parties and parade at Linn Grove I would ask that you keep a few things in mind. It is our tradition that we have a parade of costumes the day of our fall parties, Tuesday, October 31. It is great fun for all the kids to see each other's costumes. **We are asking that the costumes our students bring to school on the 31st are appropriate for all grade levels.** (Remember we have 3 year olds to 11 year olds in our building.) Please reserve the scary costumes for out of school activities. **Additionally, we are not allowing any masks to be worn at school.** (We have extra costumes for students that do not have something to dress up in for the parade, please let the teacher or Mrs. Knudson know of the need.) Parent volunteers that are approved through the district volunteer program should enter the building through the main doors for classroom parties. Parade guests will not enter the school and should line up along the track.

Learning begins promptly at 8:45 and having all of our students at school by 8:40 helps to get them in their seats and ready to go at the bell! As you know from the informational parent nights, and hopefully your kiddo(s), we have been talking a lot about the brain and growth mindsets at Linn Grove. The focus around this philosophy is that through perseverance (not giving up) and grit (effort) you can always learn new things and become more independent thinkers. When asking about your child's day, ask about something that was difficult or that they struggled with. Discuss the process they went through to overcome this difficulty or talk about ways they could have persevered.



We learn the best when we operate at the edge of our comfort zone. If we spend all of our time in our comfort zone, we are safe and won't grow and develop. When we don't struggle, we don't learn to problem solve. We have to take risks and step outside of our comfort zone to see where we struggle and how we can learn from that. Trevor Ragan refers to this philosophy as a "zoo tiger" or a "jungle tiger". A zoo tiger doesn't have to struggle for food, shelter, or daily necessities like a jungle tiger does. If you were to put a zoo tiger into the wild, how long would it survive? It's important for all students to be challenged with struggle so that they can learn how to problem solve and grow as individuals.

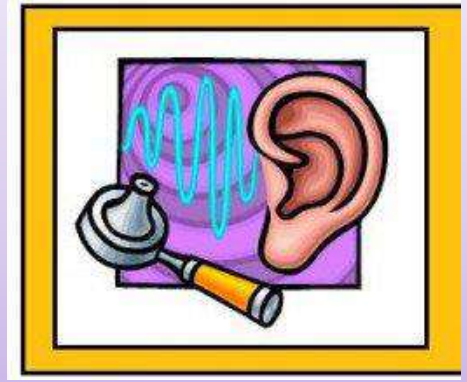

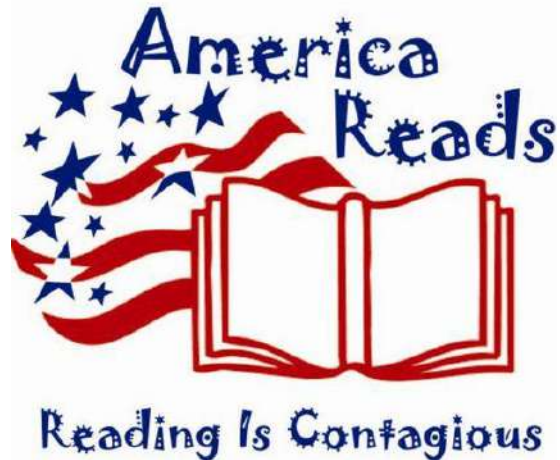

The AMERICA READS: *Reading is Contagious* event is celebrating its 21st year this fall. The program is designed to shine a spotlight on the importance of reading to young children to improve literacy and demonstrate the joy of reading through collective citizen involvement. In the Cedar Rapids metro area, it has become an annual fall tradition, bringing hundreds of volunteers into area schools to share a favorite book with students. AMERICA READS: *Reading Is Contagious* 2017 will be held Oct. 19-20.

Developed and launched in 1997, the initiative is a collaborative effort between the Cedar Rapids Community, College Community, Linn-Mar, Marion Independent, and Xavier Catholic school districts, and the five public libraries: Cedar Rapids, Ely, Fairfax, Hiawatha, and Marion. Local businesses and organizations provide financial support.

More than 2,500 guest readers visited elementary schools over the two-day period in October 2016. Some 17,000 students benefited from exposure to the enthusiastic readers. Volunteer readers include everyone from parents and middle, high school and college students to school neighbors, senior citizens, business people and local “celebrities”. The community readers share their love of reading by doing just that—each volunteer read a favorite story to a child, a small group of children or to an entire classroom of students.

Numerous studies indicate that children who have been read to on a regular basis are the ones who become good readers. Reading just 30 minutes a day with a child can significantly increase a child’s reading ability. By sharing a story, AMERICA READS volunteers also celebrate their own love of reading with students. That special book might just become someone else’s favorite! After all, reading is contagious!”
