## REFINE YOUR SEARCH



Sometimes when you search for information, you find too many results. You need to refine your search (narrow the search) to something more specific. This will give you less results to look through and will save you a lot of time.

For example, you want to search the library catalog for football. You type in football and select subject. Over 230 books come up about football. But since you only want to find out about football players, you add the word players. Now you have 23 books instead of 230.

A useful tool to use is "power search" or "advanced search". This will allow you to search more than one keyword at a time, to limit your search to books that are only a few years old or only a certain type of material. This is just another way to help you narrow your search.
