OUTCOME: I can use filters and adjustment layers in Photoshop to create a comic book frame from a photograph that is inspired by the pop art paintings of Roy Lichtenstein.


1. Open your desired image in Photoshop. It should be something that shows ACTION or an INTERACTION

## 2. ADD SOME TEXTURE TO YOUR IMAGE....


In the MENU BAR, go to FILTER > Filter Gallery... > Artistic > Film Grain. Adjust as desired, then click OK

## 3. DUPLICATE YOUR LAYER TWICE.

Name one "HALFTONE" and one "GRAPHIC PEN"



4. Hide this layer temporarily




5. With HALFTONE layer selected, go to FILTER > Pixelate > Color Halftone... Click OK

\* Set Blending Mode to DARKEN

6. Make sure COLOR PICKER is set to DEFAULT (black foreground/white background). UNHIDE "Graphic Pen" layer

7. With "Graphic Pen" layer selected, go to FILTER > Filter Gallery... > Sketch > Graphic Pen. Adjust light/dark balance as desired, then click OK.

\*set Blending mode to DARKEN



Your Comic Frame is  
ALMOST COMPLETE!

Meanwhile, at the zoo...

Use the RECTANGLE tool to outline your cell and add the yellow "setting/timeframe" box.

Use the CUSTOM SHAPE TOOL to create word/thought bubbles.

Give everything a 5-15px stroke to outline it

So you're saying you DON'T have food for me?

To make it more authentic, you need some word bubbles and some frames.

Finally, use the TYPE tool to add your words!
