Grade 12 will not be taking exams. Grade 12 students not leaving campus during the exam period may be in the South Commons or Lower Commons/Cafeteria until the 11:15 a.m. bell. Grade 12 students returning to the Door #3 entrance will not be allowed entry into the building until 11:15 a.m.

- * All students are required to be on time for all tests. Students who are late for the start of any given tests are required to make other arrangements with their respective teachers.
- * Students are not required to be in attendance when not scheduled for an exam.

SEMESTER EXAMS ON MAY 26, 30 and 31

Semester exams will run from 8:30 - 3:30 p.m. on May 26, and from 8:30 - 11:45 a.m. on May 30 and May 31. Lunch will be available all three days with busses running at 3:40 p.m. on May 26 and 12:00 p.m. on May 30 and May 31. Students do not have to be on campus during non-exam periods. Students staying on campus during non-exam periods may study in the South Commons, Upper Commons/Library or in the Lower Commons/Cafeteria. Students are not to be in the halls during exams unless with staff escort. Please plan ahead so that students are on campus on time for all exams. Students arriving after the bell will be required to make up exams at a later date/time established by the instructor.

GRADE TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts will no longer be mailed at the end of each semester. If you would like a copy of an official, signed transcript, contact the 9th - 10th Grades Office (447-3043) or the 11th - 12th Grades Office (447-3070) to make the request. Unofficial transcripts are also available at any time via PowerSchool.

HOMEROOM ON APRIL 6

The final Homeroom session of the year will be held on Thursday, April 6, at 10:00 a.m. Grades 9 and 11 will be preparing for Iowa Assessments. These grade levels should report to their Homeroom classroom. Grade 12 will report to the Auditorium for a class meeting. Preparation for the Seniors last class day volunteer opportunity on Wednesday, May 24, will be a major topic at the meeting as well as expectations for the final weeks prior to graduation. Grade 10 will be taking a required Iowa Assessment. This will allow for the schedule to not be adjusted for this required exam.

LOCKDOWN/SERIOUS THREAT (A-L-I-C-E) TRAININGS

The past two years, along with our annual fire and tornado drills, LMHS has also conducted a Lockdown/Serious Threat 'drill' to provide information and direction to students on what to do in the event of a Serious Threat within or outside of the building or a Lockdown of the building. This year, all district buildings, including LMHS, will be conducting non-intensive Lockdown/Serious Threat (A-L-I-C-E) trainings in the spring. LMHS will have three 10 minute 'drills' during the week of April 3. The purpose of the Lockdown/Serious Threat trainings is simply to inform students what to do and where to go in the event of a serious threat within or outside of the building. The three 10 minute trainings will focus on instructions for 'Run', 'Hide', and 'Fight'. Combined with safety/security protocols and infrastructure improvements, these 'drills' will help to better prepare everyone in our building should the need ever arise. LOCKDOWN OR SERIOUS THREAT

For a threat within the building: flee the building immediately.

RUN—Go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

For announced building lockdown with a threat outside of the school building: stay in the building and listen for instructions.

HIDE—Move away from outside, ground level windows and doors. Please, do not use cell phones. At some point, you will be instructed to use your cell phone to contact family and let them know that you are ok.

For a threat in your immediate area and you are unable to flee: protect yourself, and flee the building as you are able.

FIGHT—If you cannot leave a room, barricade doors, and 'arm' yourself with any objects to use to attack should a perpetrator try to enter the room. As you are able, flee the building, and go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

Linn-Mar High School Parking for 2017-18

For the 2017-18 school year, the continuation of limiting the number of issued parking tags will remain with the \$25.00 tag fee guaranteeing an on-campus parking space for students with parking tags.

11th and 12th Grades:

Lottery will determine choice of three designated parking lots (North, Far North, South).

Lottery sign up begins in late spring through Friday, August 11

Lottery takes place on Monday, August 14

Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 14.

\$25.00 for parking tag.

Students will make lot preferences on Lottery sign up form.

Three lots (North, Far North, South) should allow for all 11th and 12th grade students who are eligible for a parking tag to have one.

Students must verify a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery.

10th Grade:

Lottery will determine eligibility for parking tag.

Lottery sign up begins in late spring through Friday, August 11.

Lottery takes place on Monday, August 14.

Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 14.

\$25.00 for parking tag.

Stadium East/Aquatic Center Lot, East Lot will be 10th grade parking areas.

(May also fill spaces in Far North, North or South Lots during year as space allows).

Students must verify a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery.

9th Grade:

Armstrong Field Gravel Lot area (tag only, no fee).

Staff:

Designated areas of North Lot, South Lot, West Lot and East Lot.

Visitors:

Designated areas in the North Lot and South Lot.
