SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY AT LMHS

The February shooting at Marjorie Stoneman-Douglas High School in Florida, has brought national discussion and concern regarding school safety. In the spring of 1999, as a first-year administrator at Linn-Mar High School when the shootings took place at Columbine High School in Colorado, the reaction and attention at the time to review, update and improve school building safety seems similar to this spring of 2018. Prior to the Columbine attack, all 22 outside doors at LMHS were unlocked during the school day. No cameras existed, nor was there a sign-in procedure for visitors entering the building. Allowing quick and easy access to get into the building to get to class or activities was the primary focus. Behavior expectations/discipline, attendance procedures, and staff presence were the necessary measures in maintaining a safe school environment. Columbine changed this thinking.

In response to Columbine, by the fall of 1999, LMHS locked all but two outside doors, and our staff started lockdown training and communication protocols in the event of a security threat. Soon, 16 cameras were installed within the building, and the number of student supervisor positions was increased. Since 1999, security measures have continued to intensify. In 2018, LMHS now has push-button and sign-in entry for all visitors, with specific protocols outlined for building entry. We now have 150 cameras in the building and on campus, four campus supervisors, two student deans, three student assistance counselors, six administrators, more than 200 trained staff in our building, and an emergency response time from the Marion Police Department that is just a few minutes or less. Our school resource officer is on campus almost every day, and we typically have two or more walk-throughs from Marion Police Officers a week. Our staff continues training each year with the Marion Police, and we have a building plan (as do all district buildings) coordinated with the Marion Police should an event ever happen on campus. We are also in our third year of communicating with students regarding RUN-HIDE-FIGHT should a school safety event be taking place on or near campus.

In 1999, following Columbine, all of these measures would have been deemed appropriate and necessary to ensuring a safe and secure learning environment. In 2018, after the recent shootings, even more measures are now seen as necessary. Our district is currently undergoing a building safety inventory with both of the Marion Police and Fire Departments. We will continue to implement preventative measures, deterrent needs, counseling services, and communication protocols needed to maintain the safety of our students, staff and visitors to LMHS. This includes events and activities held during non-school hours. It is a constant. Required drills for all students in response to a serious threat on or near campus will soon become a requirement at LMHS just as our fire and natural disaster drills are each year. We will work with both the Marion Police and Marion Fire Departments as we prepare and practice our large scale responses as an entire building. We are a school, and we work to maintain an environment where students feel safe and secure at all times. Events continue to require more of our students and staff in being prepared to take action and respond during a threat situation, whether at school or in some other location. Our focus will continue to be proactive in both prevention and response. Just as in 1999, as it remains in 2018, being proactive requires a commitment to change and a constant state of alertness. I want everyone to know that our priority as a building and a district is to continue to meet this evolving safety necessity.

COMMENCEMENT ON MAY 27

Graduation for the LMHS Class of 2018 will take place at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 27, at the U.S. Cellular Center in Cedar Rapids. No tickets are required for the ceremony. Doors into the U.S. Cellular Center will open just after 12:00 p.m. A letter was recently sent to all Seniors and parents outlining expectations and providing the calendar of events for the weeks prior to Graduation.

SENIOR RECOGNITION NIGHT ON MAY 7

Recognition Night for members of the Class of 2018 will be held on Monday, May 7, in the Auditorium beginning at 7:00 p.m. Students will be recognized for awards, recognitions and scholarships.

LOCKDOWN OR SERIOUS THREAT

For a threat within the building: flee the building immediately.

RUN—Go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

For announced building lockdown with a threat outside of the school building: stay in the building and listen for instructions.

HIDE—Move away from outside, ground level windows and doors. Please, do not use cell phones. At some point, you will be instructed to use your cell phone to contact family and let them know that you are ok.

For a threat in your immediate area and you are unable to flee: protect yourself, and flee the building as you are able.

FIGHT—If you cannot leave a room, barricade doors, and 'arm' yourself with any objects to use to attack should a perpetrator try to enter the room. As you are able, flee the building, and go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

Linn-Mar High School Parking Lottery for 2018-19

LMHS limits the number of issued parking tags to ensure safety access on campus. A \$25.00 tag fee for eligible students guarantees an on-campus parking space for students with parking tags. Students must have a school permit or a valid driver's license in order to enter the lottery.

11th and 12th Grades: (750 parking tags issued in the North and South Lots)

Lottery will determine choice of three designated parking lots (North, Far North, South). Lottery sign up begins on July 16. Forms will be available in the office and on the HS website.

Lottery forms must be received by noon on **Friday**, August 10.

Students will make lot preferences on Lottery sign up form.

Lottery takes place on Monday, August 13, at noon.

Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 13, after posting of results. \$25.00 for parking tag.

Students must verify a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery.

10th Grade: (140 parking tags issued in the Stadium East/Aquatic Center Lot)

Lottery will determine eligibility for parking tag.

Lottery sign up begins on July 16. Forms will be available in the office and on the HS website.

Lottery forms must be received by noon on Friday, August 10.

Lottery takes place on Tuesday, August 14, at noon.
