NATIONAL MERIT COMPETITION HONOREES

Six LMHS students have been named as Semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. Senior semifinalists are Abbey Fitzsimmons, Tyler Hungate, Daniel Low, Morgan Lu, Matt Peng and Seth White. Students qualify as semifinalists based on PSAT results from the fall of 2016. These students scored in the top 1% of the 1.5 million students who took the PSAT. All six students are now eligible to become National Merit Scholarship Finalists. Four LMHS students have been named Commended Students in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. PSAT INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

The PSAT National Merit Scholarship Competition exam will be given on Wednesday, October 11. Every year, National Merit Scholarships are available for students based on performance on the PSAT. The assessment serves as both a practice for students planning to take the SAT, as well as the qualifier for the prestigious National Merit Scholarships. Cost for the exam is \$15, and can be paid in the Cashier's Office. Sign-up is in the 11th/12th Grade Office. The National Merit Scholarship Competition is open to all interested Juniors. 9th and 10th Grade Students interested in taking the PSAT may also do so. HOMEROOM SESSION ON THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 2

One Homeroom session is scheduled for Thursday, November 2, at 10:00 a.m.

- 12th grade students will be meeting in the Auditorium. Cap & gown and senior announcement information will be distributed.
- 11th grade students will meet in Homeroom classrooms with a focus on post-secondary planning.
- 10th grade students will meet in the Main Gym for a class ring presentation by Jostens.
- 9th grade students will meet in Homeroom classrooms for a 9th grade adjustment session on handling stress.

Homeroom is required of all students, and attendance will be taken at each session.

COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER

The College and Career Center, located adjacent to the South Commons, is staffed by school counselors and the records secretary before and during the school day. Visiting colleges and career speakers will be available in the center, as well as planning resources and information. Informational meetings will be available to students and parents during the year.

LRC CLASSROOM UPDATE

LMHS currently has three classes meeting at the LRC as the third floor sprinkler renovation takes place. It is expected that the sprinkler system will be in place on the third floor to allow for the five English classrooms to reopen at the start of 2nd Semester in mid-January. During 1st Semester, two of the English classrooms are occupying ground floor rooms at the LRC, one is meeting in the LM Aquatic Center classroom, and two are meeting in rooms inside LMHS. The FCS classroom at the LRC has not had to move location during the sprinkler renovation because it is not on the third floor. We appreciate everyone's patience as the LRC sprinkler renovation is completed.

STUDENT TUTORING REQUESTS

Request forms for receiving a student peer or adult tutor may be found in the 9th-10th Grades Office, the 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. As many requests as possible are matched with a tutor. Tutoring takes place in forty-five minute sessions between 7:30 a.m. and 4:20 p.m. in The Learning Center The Upper Commons/Library, or in the Main Office.

PEER TUTORS and ADULT TUTORS

Applications to be a Student Peer Tutor (either volunteer or for credit) may be picked up in the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, with Mrs. Cortez in the Learning Center, or online. A brief orientation meeting is required of all tutors prior to a tutoring assignment. See your counselor for questions.

Adult Tutors sign up with Community Services as a LM Volunteer. Applications are available at the LRC, LMHS or online. Contact Karla Terry, Community Services Coordinator, for questions.

EMERGENCY DRILLS AND PREPARATION

Two fire drills and two tornado/severe weather event drills were held during the first four weeks of school. Fire drills were held on September 7 (2:00 p.m.) and September 19 (10:00 a.m.). Exit from the building averaged just over two minutes (our second fire drill was under two minutes), while roll was taken at the evacuation locations in just over four minutes.

Tornado/severe weather event drills were held on August 29 (10:15 a.m.) and September 14 (2:00 p.m.). The second drill took two minutes and 42 seconds to get everyone into shelter areas. The first drill was just over three minutes. Two tornado/severe weather event drills and two fire alarms will also be held during 2nd Semester.

Students were also provided information and direction on September 15 (9:55 a.m.) regarding an Immediate Threat/Intruder/Lockdown. Students were instructed that should they ever be told that there is a serious threat or intruder in the building that they are to flee (RUN) to the nearest exit and go to either the ESCO Electric Building (using Barrington Blvd.) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road). Staff also discussed with students what to do to protect themselves (HIDE and FIGHT) if they cannot flee the building because the threat prevents them from doing so. Students were also informed that only law enforcement would be entering the building should a lockdown take place because of something happening either outside of the building on campus or in close proximity to the campus.

Our goal is to ensure that all 2400 (students, staff, visitors) people in LMHS are safe at all times. Providing information and performing 'drills' as required and necessary are part of the process for ensuring the safety of all within the building at all times. The LRC classes and Aquatic Center classes also participate in all safety drills during the school year.

'Live' A-L-I-C-E Training Event Held on September 9

LMHS held the first 'Live' training in cooperation with the Marion Police and Fire Departments on Saturday, September 9. The training was attended by 45 volunteer LMHS students. Students received an introduction to the A-L-I-C-E program and participated in three intensive active-shooter scenarios.

TIME RELEASE

Juniors and Seniors may be granted Time Release during unscheduled time if:

- 1. A parent permission form is on file in the 11th-12th Grades Office
- 2. All grades in the previous grading period were passing
- 3. In good standing with the Code of Conduct and Attendance Policy

Parents may revoke or reinstate Time Release (if eligible) at any time. Students with no Time Release are assigned to a specific seat in the Learning Center. Grades 9 and 10 do NOT have Time Release privileges and must report to The Learning Center for all unscheduled periods.

11th and 12th grade students with Time Release, who are receiving a failing grade after the sixth week of a quarter, will have Time Release revoked for the remaining three weeks of the quarter. This is to provide supervised academic study time and academic support, and should help students to successfully complete the course(s).

NAEP Exam for Selected Members of the Class of 2018

Fifty randomly selected students from the LMHS Class of 2018 will be taking the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) on Tuesday, February 27, 2018. NAEP test administrators select the fifty students in late fall, and those students will be notified of the process for taking the exam.

The exam will be taken in the LMHS Presentation-Lecture Hall beginning at 8:30 a.m. This is a national exam given to 12th grade students at the high school level. It is commonly referred to as 'the Nation's Report Card'.
