NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

Seven LMHS students have been named as Semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. Students qualify as semifinalists based on PSAT results from the fall of 2017. These students scored in the top 1% of the 1.5 million students who took the PSAT. PSAT INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

The PSAT National Merit Scholarship Competition exam will be given on Wednesday, October 10. Every year, National Merit Scholarships are available for students based on performance on the PSAT. The assessment serves as both a practice for students planning to take the SAT, as well as the qualifier for the prestigious National Merit Scholarships. Cost for the exam is \$15, and can be paid in the Cashier's Office. Sign-up is in the 11th/12th Grade Office. LMHS and LRC Fire, Tornado and Serious Threat Drills

Two fire drills and two tornado/severe weather event drills were held during the first three weeks of school. Fire drills were held on August 28 (10:15 a.m.) and September 12 (2:00 p.m.). Exit from the building averaged two minutes, while roll was taken at the evacuation locations just over four minutes. Two other fire alarms have occurred in September due to a faulty smoke detector and steam from the kitchen dishwasher.

Tornado/severe weather event drills were held on August 31(10:15 a.m.) and September 5 (2:00 p.m.). The average time to get everyone into shelter areas was just over three minutes. Two tornado/severe weather event drills and two fire alarms will also be held during 2nd Semester.

A Serious Threat-Intruder Evacuation drill was held on Wednesday, September 19, at 10:05 a.m. with assistance from the Marion Police. A scenario of a potential active shooter in a specific area of LMHS was used during the drill. The purpose of the drill was to remind students that should a serious threat be present within the building to flee (RUN) the building and go to either of two evacuation areas (Indian Creek C.C. or the ESCO building).

During the drill, students exited the building and proceeded to Armstrong Field and the grassy area at the corner of Tower Terrace and 10th St. where they were organized for transport to the district reunification site (district Transportation adjacent to Hwy. 13).

Ten classrooms were made to be in HIDE mode, during the drill, and preparing to FIGHT should a perpetrator penetrate the blockade created within the classroom doors.

Our goal is to ensure that all 2600 (students, staff, visitors) people in LMHS and the LRC are safe at all times. Providing information and performing 'drills' as required and necessary are part of the process for ensuring the safety of all within the building at all times. LMHS and the LRC jointly participate in all safety drills during the school year.

'Live' A-L-I-C-E Training Event To Be Held on October 13

LMHS will hold a 'Live' training in cooperation with the Marion Police on Saturday, October 13. The training is voluntary for all LMHS students. During the training, students will receive an introduction to the A-L-I-C-E program and participate in three intensive active-shooter scenarios. The Marion Police, led by district School Resource Officer Tom Daubs, along with LMHS A-L-I-C-E training Chris Robertson lead the A-L-I-C-E training. Students interested in participating in the A-L-I-C-E training on October 13, may sign up in either the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or the Main Office.

11th Grade students will be taking the Iowa Youth Survey.


10th Grade students will report to the Main Gym for a class ring presentation by Jostens.

EARLY GRADUATION REQUESTS

Any seniors planning to graduate at the end of 1st Semester are required by Board Policy to have a signed Early Graduation form to the Principal's Office by December 1, 2018. Students wishing to graduate at the end of 3rd Quarter must have a signed Early Graduation form to the Principal's Office by March 1, 2019. Students should see their counselor for information regarding Early Graduation and the form required prior to School Board approval.



POWERSCHOOL AND POWERSCHOOL LEARNING

The student information system, PowerSchool, requires passcodes for both student and parent. <u>Parents with more than one student in school will use the same passcode for each student</u>. The information viewed on PowerSchool is the same for both student and parent. Please feel free to contact the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or Main Office for assistance with PowerSchool. If you have questions regarding student academic scores, please contact your student's teacher for clarification. If a question or issue remains following the teacher contact, please do not hesitate to contact the Main Office, 9th-10th Grades Office, or the 11th-12th Grades Office for assistance.

Classes are also reporting on student progress toward specific priority standards. This progress is also found on PowerSchool. Both traditional course grading and student progress toward the specific standards are kept for all LMHS courses and are available on PowerSchool. For questions regarding finding this information, feel free to contact the 9th-10th Grades Office (447-3043), 11th-12th Grades Office (447-3070), Main Office (447-3040), or your student's counselor.

Beginning in 2018-19, LMHS will also be implementing PowerSchool Learning to complement PowerSchool. PowerSchool Learning is a system designed to help organize learning resources and activities for each course at LMHS. Teachers have been exposed to PowerSchool Learning, but will just begin to utilize and test the instructional capabilities of the system this fall.

LEARNING CENTER

The Learning Center is a program for all Linn-Mar students and serves as an extension of the classroom. The Learning Center is led by the Academic Intervention Teacher (Becky Cortez) in cooperation with teachers and counselors. The Learning Center gives students the opportunity to work on core instruction, and provides enrichment opportunities or time for individual study and group collaboration.

All 9th and 10th grade students are assigned to the Learning Center during non-class periods.

STUDENT TUTORING REQUESTS

Tutoring takes place in forty-five minute sessions between 7:30 a.m. and 4:20 p.m. in The Learning Center The Upper Commons/Library, or in the Main Office.

PEER TUTORS and ADULT TUTORS

Applications to be a Student Peer Tutor (either volunteer or for credit) may be picked up in the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. A brief orientation meeting is required of all tutors prior to a tutoring assignment. See your counselor for questions.

TIME RELEASE

Juniors and Seniors may be granted Time Release during unscheduled time if:

- 1. A parent permission form is on file in the 11th-12th Grades Office
- 2. All grades in the previous grading period were passing
- 3. In good standing with the Code of Conduct and Attendance Policy

Parents may revoke or reinstate Time Release (if eligible) at any time. Students with no Time Release are assigned to a specific seat in the Learning Center. Grades 9 and 10 do NOT have Time Release privileges and must report to The Learning Center for all unscheduled periods. 11th and 12th grade students with Time Release, who are receiving a failing grade after the sixth week of a quarter, will have Time Release revoked for the remaining three weeks of the quarter. This is to provide supervised academic study time and academic support, and should help students to successfully complete the course(s).

MEDICATION

Students who must take prescribed medication at school must have written authorization on file in the Health Office. Non-prescribed medication will be given with physician and parent approval only. Students are not to carry any medication at any time without a note of approval from the school nurse. Contact the Health Office at 447-3080 for questions.

LUNCH MONEY

Lunch money may be deposited into accounts each day in the Cashier's Office any time from 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. For the deposit to be applied to the current day's lunch account, the deposit must be made by 10:15 a.m. Money may also be deposited online using a link on the district website.
