Areas of Instructional Focus

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS & SERVICES

American College Testing

Linn-Mar students score well above state and national averages on standardized tests such as the ACT, SAT, or ITED. The 2013-2014 composite average ACT score for all LMHS students was 24.5. The average composite score for all lowa students during the same time period was 22 and the national average was 21.76% of Linn-Mar High School students took the ACT. A score of 20 or higher on the 36 point scale indicates probable success in college.

National Merit Achievement Program

Linn-Mar has had a large number of National Merit Scholars, Academic All-State recipients, and State of Iowa Scholars in its sixty-five year history. During the 2013-2014 school year, Linn-Mar High School had five National Merit Scholar Semifinalists, as well as five National Merit Scholar Commended Students named.

Linn-Mar's Advance Placement (AP) information for the Class of 2014*:

Linn-Mar Community Schools offered the following AP coursework: Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English, Microeconomics, Music Theory, Physics, Psychology, Statistics, US Government, US History and World History.

743 Linn-Mar students enrolled in at least one AP course and 581 exams were taken in 2014. 20 different AP subject tests were taken by Linn-Mar students.

Nationally, 20.1% of 2014 graduates scored over a 3 on AP exams. At Linn-Mar, 83.4% of scores were higher than a 3. Linn-Mar's composite average AP exam score was 3.85 versus the national average of 2.87.






