Teacher Leadership Program

In March of 2014, Linn-Mar was one of 39 school districts awarded the Teacher Leadership Grant by the Iowa Department of Education. The Teacher Leadership and Compensation (TLC) system provides opportunities for a minimum of 25% of teaching staff to participate in leadership roles.

Teachers at Linn-Mar work with instructional coaches to improve classroom instruction and the delivery of content to influence student performance. Technology Integration Coaches work with teachers on how to infuse technology into the current curriculum and our Mentor Coaches work with first and second year teachers providing intense support.

At Linn-Mar there are 20 full time teacher leaders and around 129 classroom teachers who participate in a variety of leadership roles in curriculum, PBIS, technology, MTSS, and model teaching.

- Attract and retain new teachers by providing ongoing professional development, classroom support, and a comprehensive mentoring program for first and second year teachers.
- Provide increased opportunities for collaboration between teachers.
- Increase professional development and leadership opportunities for staff.
- Improve student achievement by strengthening instruction.

LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

District–wide Repairs and Renovation Projects 2015-2016

The High School Renovation Project:

The summer of 2015 brought major physical changes to the Linn-Mar High School. Crews removed much of the original 1959 building and construction was in full force to create exciting, new learning spaces which were occupied and completed throughout the 2015-16 school year. The Class of 2016 celebrated their prom night in the new "south commons".

Construction began on the High School Kitchen Renovation in May 2016. The project will greatly enhance traffic flow and provide students and staff a greater selection of breakfast and lunch options upon completion in August 2016.

The entire high school renovation project will be completed in the spring of 2017.

Westfield Elementary Addition:

Construction began on a total of six new additional classrooms, a computer lab, new restrooms, and two smaller rooms for individualized or small group instruction. Project completion is anticipated for early spring 2017.

Oak Ridge Middle School Cafeteria:

In the spring of 2016, construction began on the Oak Ridge Middle School Cafeteria expansion. The addition, located in the very front of the building, will provide much needed "elbow room" for a growing population of middle school diners. This project will be completed during the winter of 2016.

Elementary Schools

Multiple Linn-Mar elementary schools received construction updates. Bowman Woods received a partial roof repair, Echo Hill and Westfield benefitted from parking lot repairs, Indian Creek received partial window and flooring replacements, Wilkins had bathroom upgrades completed and Novak's preschool playground expansion was finalized.
