Teacher and Learning

The Linn-Mar Community School District strives to have a vibrant curriculum in every classroom. Our teachers work hard to implement the lowa Academic Standards. These are clear and rigorous learning standards educators use to ensure all students are college, career, and future ready.

The district continues to have a strong focus on literacy and math instruction. Teachers have worked to understand better the science of reading to strengthen classroom instruction in literacy. New literacy programs were purchased that better align with the science of reading instruction. Additionally, mathematics instruction has been targeted to help accelerate learning gaps from the pandemic. A group of math strategists has been working in grades K-6 with teachers to improve math instruction. The district supported this by purchasing new mathematics tools that are better aligned with the lowa Academic Standards.

Linn-Mar's teacher leadership program provides instructional coaches the opportunity to collaborate with teachers to meet the demands of the Iowa Academic Standards. Linn-Mar's Teacher Leadership System is annually recognized as one of the best programs in the state.

Learning During a Pandemic

The global health pandemic affected all our students, however Linn-Mar was in a strong position to meet the challenges of interrupted learning. Most importantly, our teachers were able to provide a dual-platform of learning. We were able to meet our learners that were in onsite school classrooms as well as students that were able to join instruction remotely. This allowed instruction to continue to occur even during the most difficult months of the pandemic.

To address gaps in student learning, we must maximize opportunities through "just in time" scaffolds and lessons that present themselves throughout this year and following years. This scaffolded approach will allow us to fill gaps in students' learning. A remedial focus on unfinished instruction could cause students to remain perpetually behind in instruction. Therefore, we are addressing learning gaps as students encounter them in the classroom.


