Young Authors Contest GUIDELINES 2015-2016

School Level Information

- 1. All students enrolled in grades K-12 are eligible.
- 2. Categories of writing are: (500 word maximum)
 - 1. Poetry
 - 2. Fiction
 - 3. Non-Fiction
- 3. Grade levels: Regular Education:

Regular Education:K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12Special Education:K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12

Gifted students are to be entered in the regular education categories only – not special education categories.

- 4. Information/Permission form:
 - Must be completely filled out (typed not written on the form provided) and signed by student and parent.
 - Stapled <u>back-to-back</u> with entry.
 - Use complete school names, not initials.
 - Be sure the council name is on the permission form.
 - Copy all winning entries on a CD or flash drive. Create two folders on the CD or flash drive Regular Education and Special Education. I just need the entry not the permission form on the CD/flash drive. Write the council's name on the CD or flash drive.
 - All entries should be individual files saved in the digital folders. The entries should not be in one document only. Files should be named as the title of the work.
 - PLEASE <u>**DO NOT SCAN**</u> ENTRIES AS THE DIGITAL COPIES. Entries must be <u>typed</u> using <u>Microsoft Word Not Adobe</u>.
 - Digital files <u>ONLY</u> should include the student's name, teacher's name, school name, and the local council name. Please see the format below.

 - Zachary Area Reading Council
- 5. Entries:
 - Must be student's own work and completed in class.
 - Must be typed with 1" margins all around, 12 pt. font, Times New Roman. <u>DO NOT DOUBLE SPACE</u> <u>THE ENTRIES.</u>
 - Must be free of grammatical and mechanical errors.
 - No student names, teacher names, or school names should appear anywhere on the written entry as a heading or notation for class assignment.
 - Must be no longer than 500 words.
 - No pictures or drawings on the entries.
 - Will be judged on originality and creativity.
 - Entries that do not meet all guidelines will be disqualified no exceptions!
- 6. School judging:
 - Select one school winner for each category at each grade level. (No more than <u>one</u> selection per student can be submitted in each category.)
 - Copy entries and keep originals.
 - Send copies with permission forms stapled back-to-back with entries to the district chairperson. Districts should set a due date that occurs prior to the release of students and teachers for the Christmas holidays.
 - Schools should check for plagiarism. No winning entries should be plagiarized.
