The crowd was estimated to be in the thousands. Many of the people were wearing dark clothing, and some were holding signs or banners. The atmosphere appeared to be one of tension and anticipation. The crowd was moving slowly, and there were reports of some minor disturbances. The police were on hand to maintain order, but they seemed overwhelmed by the size of the gathering. The event was being covered by the media, and there were several news cameras and reporters present. The location was a large open area, possibly a park or a public square, and the weather was clear. The event was organized by a group of activists, and they were demanding that the government take action on a particular issue. *Mrs. Dantrassy outlined and reviewed the Strategic Plan goals and discussed how we are using our testing data to design and implement ways to achieve these goals.

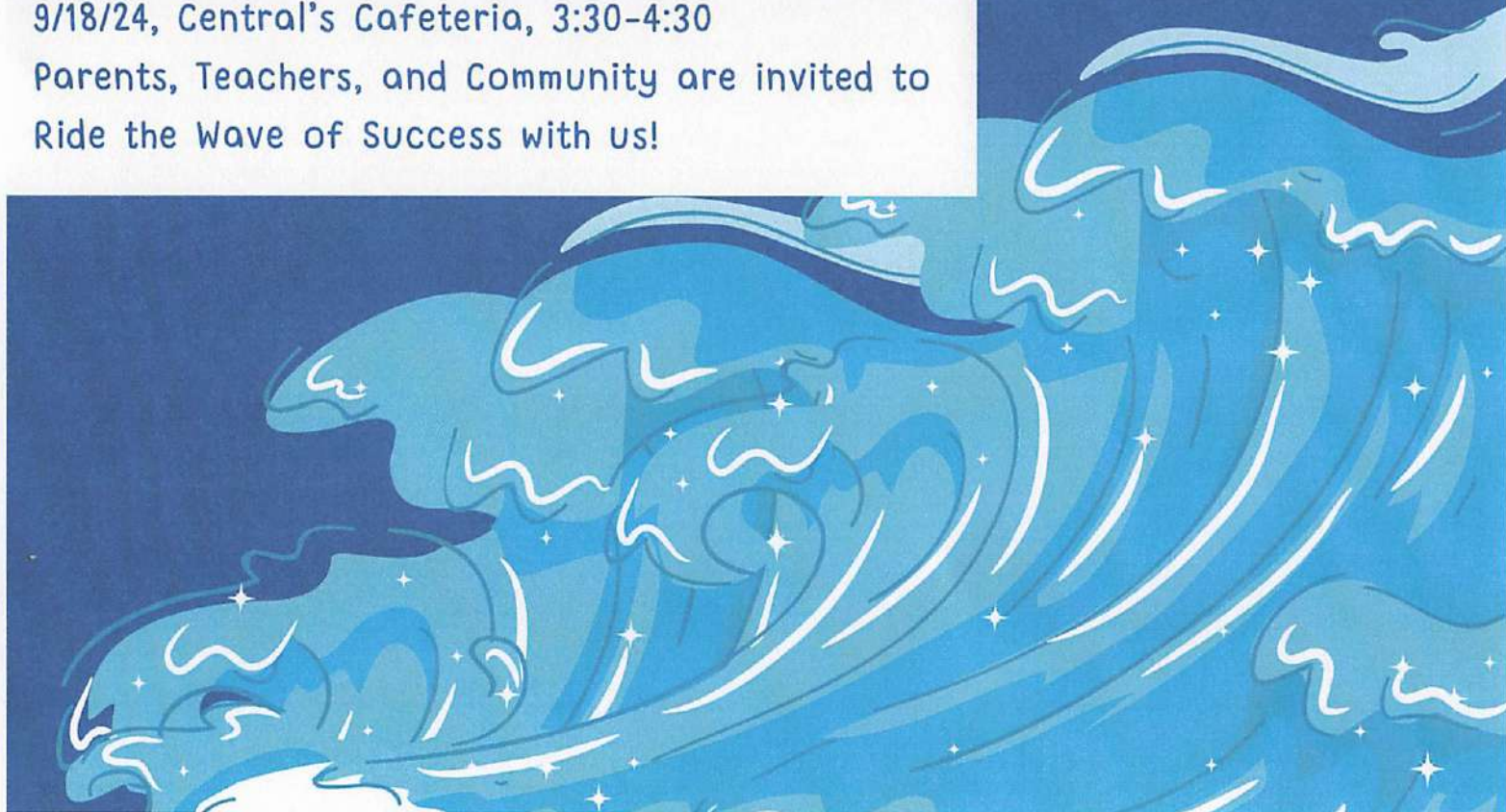
* The county attendance initiative was discussed.
