I. Safety and Security

- a. Security Officers are continuing to support our schools
- b. Deputies visit to conduct security walk-throughs
- c. Flinn has practiced 3 lockdown drills, 1 shelter-in-place, and 6 fire drills to date (per county regulations)
- d. Pending items...
 - o a shade for the office window across from Leah
 - o fixing the deadbolt on inside of office door so that the door can be bolted from the inside as well
 - o keypad on the inside of the office complex by the door by the mailboxes
 - o Door #10 (exterior Library door) is jammed due to the building setting/shifting (...other doors on the front side of the building swell in the hot months and can jam as well)

Update: Maintenance came by last week...they assessed every exterior door. All doors are able to be opened except Door #10. It was shared that to fix that door would be quite the undertaking (...possibly tearing out that section of the building and reconstructing it.

Instead of a shade for the window across from Leah's desk, we discussed looking a film (such as the 2-way mirror film). Mrs. Wiseman suggested to look into John Taylor's local business, who is also a vendor.

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Regarding the jammed door, Mrs. Clendenin and Sandra Lilly gave an update on Mr. Lilly's attempt to help us find a solution for the structural issues in our building. Mrs. Clendenin indicated that she asked Mr. Lilly to discuss this with the KCS Safety Department since this jammed door prevents people from being able to exit due to fire or armed intruder.

On 1/30/25, KCS maintenance men did come to check all exterior doors around the building and confirmed that Door #10 is still jammed so tightly that it cannot be opened. This is due to the structural issues – we have a large crack in the library wall that is getting worse. KCS maintenance said they'd share their findings with their supervisor.

- II. Student Discipline Policy/Positive Behavior Support (SOAR) – as of 7:00am on 2/3/25
- a. 22 office referrals since last meeting on 12/9 – that included 6 timeouts, 3 assignments of Lunch Detention, 3 assignments of Out of School Suspension, 5 assignments of In-School Suspension, 2 contacts from administrator to parent (as the only consequence in that referral), 2 Lost Activities, and 1 Lost Bus Privileges.
 - K – 9 referrals
 - 1st grade – 3 referrals
 - 2nd grade – 7 referrals
 - 3rd grade – 2 referrals
 - 4th grade – 1 referral
- III. SOAR:
- 2nd 9 Weeks Point Goals: PreK – 10 K- 20 ; 1st- 30 ; 2nd- 40; 3rd- 35; 4th- 36.
 - 2nd Nine Weeks Celebration, held in late January was STEM activities
 - Planning Stages of 3rd and 4th 9 Weeks SOAR Celebrations: Magician and Glow Party
 - Survey being drafted for next year's SOAR celebrations

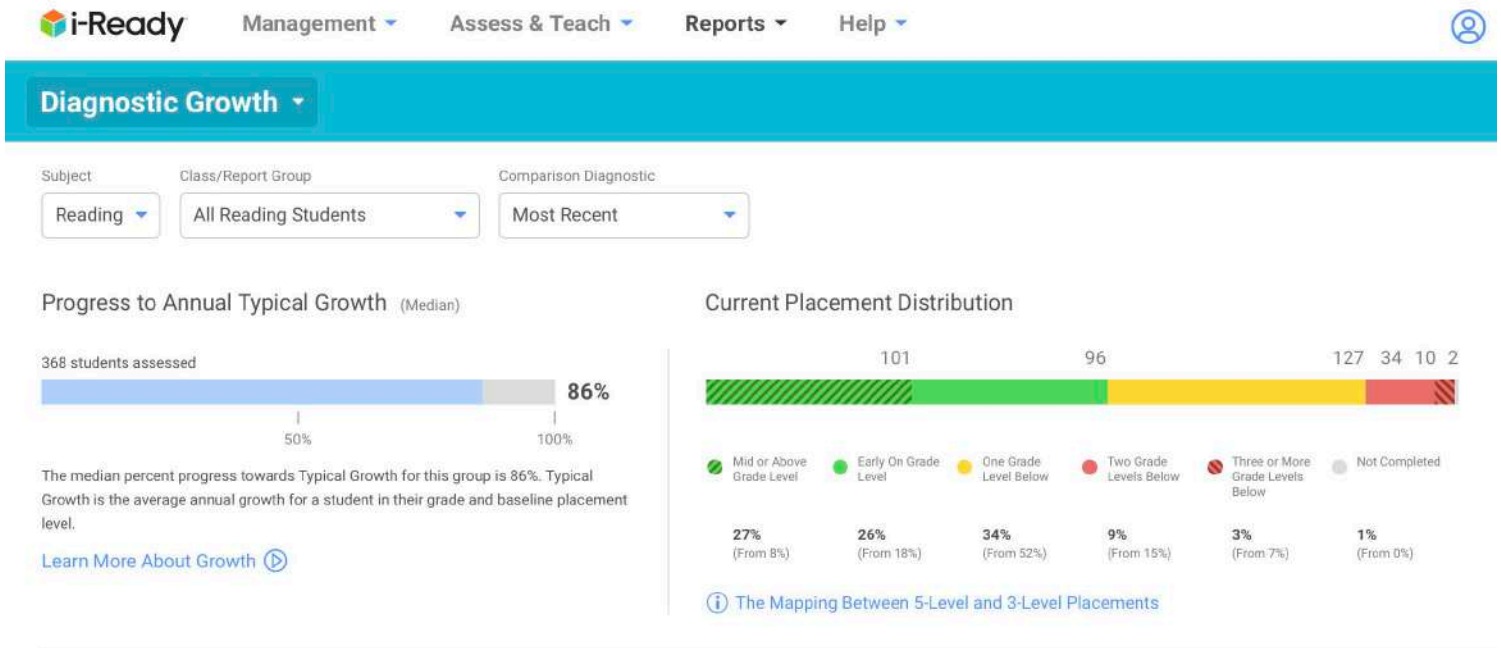
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IV. Student Attendance

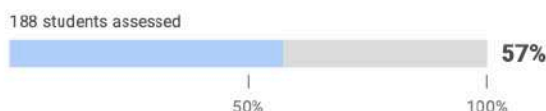


Diagnostic Growth

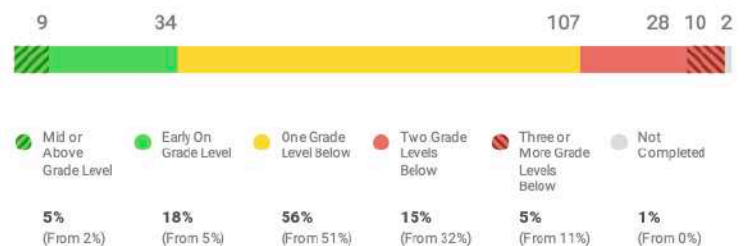


Subject: Math
