- 3. Read and interpret historical documents for meaning
- 4. Ise primary and secondary sources and your own critical analysis to construct essays and a culminating research paper.
- 5. Appreciate and discuss current and historical events and see the link between the past and the present.
- 6. Understand the importance of geography in American history.

II. GRADING

Grading Information

With the 2018-2019 school year, Montgomery High School will be using a semester system. Below is a breakdown of the categories that will be used in the grade book as well as information regarding the total points, and percentages, for each semester:

If you are absent on the day of an assessment, you will be expected to plan to take the assessment at the next after school help session. An alternate assessment may be given to students who miss class on the day of a test. Tests must be made up BEFORE THE FOLLOWING ASSESSMENT IS GIVEN OR IT WILL RESULT IN A ZERO. Re-Takes are NOT permitted or offered.

Assessment Remediation - Students can earn a 50% on any assessment worth 10% or more of the semester grade through remediation. Remediation much be scheduled within 48 hours of the grade being posted and must be completed before the following unit assessment is administered.

Work missed due to absence must be handed in, at the beginning of the next class, within the same number of missed classes (i.e. if you are absent two blocks, all missed work must be submitted at the beginning of the second block upon return).

All digital submissions are due on the assigned date/time (whether the student is present in class or not) unless there are extenuating circumstances as determined by the teacher.

- Homework checks will not be announced, nor will they be posted ahead of time on the whiteboard, GENESIS or Google Classroom. However, homework checks should be expected every class.

Late homework will NOT be accepted unless discussed with the teacher.

- Projects lose 10% of their grade per day it is late.

III. TEXTBOOK – THE AMERICANS

We will be using an online textbook this year and you will be provided access to the book and resources. You are also responsible for the appropriate use of your assigned Chromebook in class.

IV. CLASSROOM CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Timeliness.

Being on time for class shows respect for the class, your classmates, the teacher, and helpts to limit interruptions as class is getting started. Lateness will be recorded and dealt with accordingly. A pass is expected from either your previous teacher or the Administration

VI. E-BOOK AND CHROMEBOOK USE POLICY FOR USII

1:1 Classroom/BYOD

The Social Studies department and many of the courses it offers are taught in a 1:1 classroom environment. Most content materials are provided electronically and are accessible through the Google Classroom. Students are required to bring their own device to class each day. The District will provide devices for students who are unable to provide their own (see your Guidance Counselor to obtain a device for the school year). Devices must meet the District's minimum requirements for the BYOD program. You will need access to your student Google account for most classes.

MHS is a BYOD district. All students are expected to have an Internet-connected device with them each day. Devices must meet the mandatory tech specs listed on the MTSD website. It is highly recommended that students have an 8+ inch screen and physical keyboard. Students must abide by the district's AUP.

 - c. I will not copy others' work.
 - d. I will not copy any information from the Internet or print sources and submit it as my own, this includes information created by an AI site.
 - e. I will not share my work with others, regardless of the intent.
- 2. I will not give help nor accept help from another student during a test or graded assignment unless express permission is given by the teacher.
 - a. I will not discuss assessment questions or prompts with other students who have not yet taken the assessment.
