# Draw Me! FOLLOW THESE STEPS:

**1.** Start with a big letter O.  
(It appears in words like "Mo"!)

**2.** Now draw a smaller letter O inside of it.  
(You've drawn a doughnut!)

**3.** Next, you have a choice between two letters—M or W— but draw the letter on its side.  
(You made a beak!)

**4.** We're going to place the eye next, which is the most important part of the drawing, because the eye shows how the character is feeling. Make sure to darken it in.  
(You always look at the darkest part of a drawing first!)

**5.** Draw two lines going straight down for the neck.

**6.** Next, draw two lines across the neck for the collar.

**7.** The body is a circ-angle—a triangle and a circle combined.  
(It kind of looks like an ice cream cone that's fallen over.)

**8.** The legs are two more lines straight down from the body.  
(Just like the neck!)

**9.** Almost done! Draw the letter V three times. The first two are upside down for the feet. The third is on its side in the body for the wing.

## FINISHED!

Great job! That's an awesome Pigeon!


Once you've gotten the basic drawing down, mix it up. Move The Pigeon's beak, wings, eye, or legs to create lots of funny poses!



# DRAW ELEPHANT GERALD IN 6 STEPS!

If you know how to draw shapes and write your name, you are ready to draw Elephant Gerald!

That's because drawing is just a bunch of shapes and letters put together in the right order. Let's try it!

1



Start with Gerald's trunk. Draw two number 7s, one above the other.



Then draw a line to close the bottom.

2



Draw a circle around Elephant Gerald's trunk for his head.

3



Gerald needs glasses. Draw two circles for the frames. Then draw three straight lines to finish them.

4



Draw two dots for his eyes.

5



Draw a sideways letter C for his smile.


6



His ears are squ-ovals. (Square on the bottom and round on the top).

# DRAW PIGGIE IN 6 STEPS!



If you know how to draw shapes and write your name, you are ready to draw Piggie!


That's because drawing is just a bunch of shapes and letters put together in the right order. Let's try it!

1



First, draw a big Mo-val.  
(A Mo-val is a circle that looks like an egg).

2



Inside the Mo-val, draw a smaller Mo-val.

3




Draw the number 11 twice.

4



Make the top number 11 bigger,  
(like inflating a balloon).

5



Take the letter **M** and cut it in half.



Place each half on either side for Piggie's ears.


6



Draw a backwards **C** for Piggie's mouth.







# DRAW CAT THE CAT IN 7 STEPS!

If you know how to draw shapes and write your name, you are ready to draw Cat the Cat!

That's because drawing is just a bunch of shapes and letters put together in the right order. Let's try it!

<p><b>1</b></p> <p>First, draw a big letter <b>O</b>. It appears in words like Mol!</p>	<p><b>2</b></p> <p>Inside the big letter <b>O</b>, draw two smaller letter <b>O</b>s.</p>
<p><b>3</b></p> <p>Inside the eyes make two big dots. Cat the Cat can see!</p>	<p><b>4</b></p> <p>Draw an oval. Darken it in. That's the nose!</p>

<p><b>5</b></p> <p>Draw the letter <b>V</b> for Cat the Cat's smile.</p>	<p>Then connect the nose to the mouth with a number 1.</p>
<p><b>6</b></p> <p>Draw two big upside down letter <b>V</b>s. Cat the Cat has ears!</p>	<p><b>7</b></p> <p>Draw three straight lines on both sides of the face to make the whiskers.</p>
<p><b>FINISHED!</b></p> <p>What a great job! Don't forget to sign your name so everyone can see what a great job <b>YOU</b> did drawing Cat the Cat!</p> <p>Your Name!</p>






Wilbur's head is a rectangle with curved edges, like a bathtub. Let's draw one!

2




Make an upsidetown letter **U** on top of Wilbur's head.



Then add a sideways letter **U** on the side.

3




Draw a small line inside each of the letter **Us**. Those are the ears.

4




Below the ears, draw two dots for eyes.

5



Draw two more dots at the bottom for nostrils.


6



Under the nostrils draw a long rectangle, then put a line in the middle of it for the teeth.

# DRAW LEONARDO IN 8 STEPS!

If you know how to draw shapes and write your name, you are ready to draw Leonardo, the Terrible Monster!


That's because drawing is just a bunch of shapes and letters put together in the right order. Let's try it!

1




First, draw a big letter **O**. It appears in words like Mo!

2



Inside the big letter **O**, draw two smaller letter **O**s for the eyes.

3



Inside the eyes, make two dots.

4



Draw a letter **U** for the nose.



Add two dots at the bottom.

5




Turn the letter **V** upside down to draw the horns.

6



For the mouth, draw a letter **I** that has fallen down. Leonardo is a terrible monster, so he's not smiling.

7



Leonardo's fur is squiggly! Add squiggles all around his head!

8



Let's add two curves on Leonardo's mouth. Now he's smiling!


