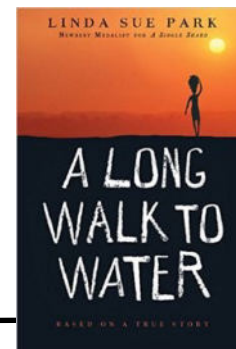


A LONG WALK TO WATER

Then, write two paragraphs explaining their similarities and differences.</p>
